3 Relating to Baldwin County; to authorize the Baldwin 4 County Commission to regulate the permitting, construction, 5 placement, and operation of wind turbines, wind mills, wind 6 farms and any other wind-generated energy production 7 facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in part, by wind 8 in the unincorporated areas of Baldwin County, Alabama; to 9 authorize the Baldwin County Commission to establish 10 standards, specifications, criteria, and conditions on the permitting, construction, placement, and operation of wind 11 turbines, wind mills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated 12 13 energy production facilities or equipment operated, in whole 14 or in part, by wind in the unincorporated areas of Baldwin 15 County; to authorize and allow the Baldwin County Commission 16 to determine the appropriate locations where wind turbines, wind mills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy 17 production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in 18 19 part, by wind may be located or allowed and to prohibit the same, if deemed necessary by the Baldwin County Commission; to 20 21 authorize and allow the Baldwin County Commission to establish 22 remedies and penalties for the violation of any laws, 23 ordinances, rules, or regulations adopted pursuant to this act; to authorize the Baldwin County Commission to determine 24 25 the terms and conditions of any exceptions and exemptions from the provisions of any laws, ordinances, rules, or regulations adopted pursuant to this act; and to provide that the authority granted to the Baldwin County Commission pursuant to this act shall be in addition to, and not in substitution of, any powers or authority granted to the Baldwin County Commission pursuant to any other laws, rules or regulations. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. This act shall apply within all 9 unincorporated areas of Baldwin County.

10 Section 2. (a) The county commission shall have 11 zoning zoning authority and the power to establish and adopt ordinances, resolutions, rules, regulations, and procedures to 12 13 regulate the permitting, construction, placement, and 14 operation of wind turbines, windmills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy production facilities or equipment 15 16 operated, in whole or in part, by wind, sometimes referred to 17 collectively as "wind-generated energy production facilities," also including, but not limited to, regulations regarding the 18 19 size, location, and noise generated by wind-generated energy 20 production facilities. The regulations shall be adopted by 21 ordinance or resolution of the county commission at a 22 regularly scheduled meeting of the commission.

(b) The county commission shall have <u>zoning</u> zoning
 authority and the power to establish and adopt ordinances,
 resolutions, rules, regulations, and procedures establishing

standards, specifications, criteria, and conditions related to the permitting, construction, placement, and operation of wind turbines, wind mills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in part, by wind in the unincorporated areas of Baldwin County.

(c) The county commission shall have zoning zoning 7 8 authority and the power to establish and adopt ordinances, 9 rules, regulations, policies, and procedures to establish and 10 determine the appropriate locations where wind turbines, wind mills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy 11 production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in 12 13 part, by wind may be located or allowed and to prohibit the 14 same, if deemed necessary by the county commission.

15 As part of the commission's authority, the 16 commission is to provide for a minimum setback for 17 wind-generated energy production facilities that is no closer laterally than one and one-half times the height of the tower 18 19 to an overhead electrical power line, excluding secondary electrical service lines or service drops. The commission may 20 21 also provide for a minimum setback from underground electrical 22 and gas distribution lines.

(d) If any building or structure is erected,
constructed, altered, repaired, converted, operated, or
maintained, or if any land is used, in violation of this act

or any ordinance, resolution, rule, regulation, or procedure 1 2 promulgated under the authority conferred by this act, the 3 county commission, or other appropriate administrative officer designated by the county commission, may institute any 4 5 appropriate action or proceeding to prevent an unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, 6 7 conversion, operation, maintenance, or use of the land or to 8 restrain, correct, or abate the violation, or to prevent the 9 use of any building or structure, or to prevent any illegal 10 act, conduct, business, or misuse in or upon any premises 11 regulated under the authority conferred by this act. In addition to the foregoing, the county commission may adopt 12 13 ordinances or regulations providing for a penalty in the form 14 of a fine for the violation of the provisions of any ordinance, resolution, rule, regulation, or procedure 15 16 promulgated under this act. The fine shall not exceed one 17 thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) and costs of court for each 18 offense. Each day the violation continues shall constitute a 19 separate offense. In addition, any violation shall be a public 20 nuisance. Upon a finding that a building or structure violates the provisions of any ordinance, resolution, rule, regulation, 21 22 or procedure adopted pursuant to this act, the county 23 commission may remove such building or structure, and all 24 costs of removal shall be assessed against the landowner and

1 recorded as a lien on the property and may be enforced until 2 satisfied.

3 (e) The county commission may levy permit and application fees deemed necessary to administer the 4 5 ordinances, resolutions, rules, regulations, or procedures adopted pursuant to this act. The fees shall cover the cost of 6 administrative activities and the cost of reviewing 7 8 applications, including the costs or fees of any experts or 9 consultants deemed necessary to assist the county in reviewing 10 applications.

11 (f) The county commission shall have the authority and power to establish rules and procedures to determine the 12 13 terms and conditions of any exceptions and exemptions from the 14 provisions of any laws, ordinances, rules, or regulations 15 adopted pursuant to this act. In addition, any ordinance or 16 resolution adopted pursuant to this act shall authorize a 17 variance process to be determined by the county commission. 18 Furthermore, any ordinance or resolution adopted pursuant to 19 this act shall include a variance appeals process for any party aggrieved by a final variance decision of the county 20 21 commission to appeal therefrom to the Circuit Court of Baldwin 22 County.

(g) The authority granted to the county commission
 pursuant to this act shall be in addition to, and not in
