27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the term "public assistance benefits" means money or property provided directly or indirectly to eligible persons through programs of the federal government, the state, or any political subdivision thereof, and administered by the Alabama Department of Human Resources.

7 (b)(1) A recipient of public assistance benefits may 8 not use any portion of the benefits for the purchase of any 9 alcoholic beverage, tobacco product, or lottery ticket. Any 10 person who violates this subsection shall reimburse the 11 Department of Human Resources for the purchase and shall be 12 subject to the following sanctions:

a. Upon the first violation, the person shall be
 disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by
 means of direct cash payment or an electronic benefits
 transfer access card for one month.

b. Upon the second violation, the person shall be
disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by
means of direct cash payment or electronic benefits transfer
access card for three months.

c. Upon a third or subsequent violation, the person
shall be permanently disqualified from receiving public
assistance benefits by means of direct cash payment or an
electronic benefits transfer access card.

(2) A person who is disqualified from receiving
 public assistance benefits under this subsection shall have

the right to a hearing pursuant to the Alabama Administrative
 Procedure Act.

(c) (1) A cash recipient of public assistance 3 4 benefits may not withdraw or use cash benefits by means of an Electronic Benefits Transfer transaction for the purchase of 5 goods or services in a retail establishment the primary 6 7 purchase of which is the sale of alcoholic beverages, a casino, a tattoo facility, a facility providing psychic 8 9 services, or an establishment that provides adult-oriented 10 entertainment in which performers disrobe or perform in an 11 unclothed state. Any person who violates this subsection shall 12 reimburse the Department of Human Resources for the amount 13 withdrawn and used and shall be subject to the following 14 sanctions:

a. Upon the first violation, the person shall be
 disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by
 means of direct cash payment or an electronic benefits
 transfer access card for a period of one month.

b. Upon the second violation, the person shall be
disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by
means of direct cash payment or electronic benefits transfer
access card for a period of three months.

c. Upon a third or subsequent violation, the person
 shall be permanently disqualified from receiving public
 assistance benefits by means of direct cash payment or an
 electronic benefits transfer access card.

(2) A person who is disqualified from receiving
 public assistance benefits under this subsection shall have
 the right to a hearing pursuant to the Alabama Administrative
 Procedure Act.

(d) (1) The Department of Human Resources shall 5 consult with providers of automatic teller machine services to 6 7 create and implement a program or method of blocking access to cash benefits from Electronic Benefits Transfer cards issued 8 by the department at automatic teller machines located in a 9 10 retail establishment the primary purchase of which is the sale of alcoholic beverages, a casino, a tattoo facility, a 11 12 facility providing psychic services, or an establishment that 13 provides adult-oriented entertainment in which performers 14 disrobe or perform in an unclothed state.

(2) If the department requires a federal waiver to
implement this section, the department shall apply immediately
for the federal waiver.

(e) The Department of Human Resources shall adoptrules to implement this act.
