19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:	
20	Section 1. The following amendment to the

24	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution

26	PROPOSED AMENDMENT	

1 Every person shall be at liberty to worship God 2 according to the dictates of his or her own conscience. No person shall be compelled to attend, or, against his or her 3 4 consent, to contribute to the erection or support of any place of religious worship, or to pay tithes, taxes, or other rates 5 6 for the support of any minister of the gospel. Property 7 belonging to the state may be used for historically significant displays which reflect the foundations of the rule 8 of law in America, notwithstanding that such displays may also 9 10 have religious significance, and the right of a public school and public body to display such displays on property owned or 11 12 administrated by a public school or public body in this state 13 is not restrained or abridged provided that the display is 14 consistent with a policy approved by the governing authority 15 of the public school or public body. The civil and political rights, privileges, and capacities of no person shall be 16 17 diminished or enlarged on account of his or her religious belief. No public funds may be expended in defense of the 18 constitutionality of this amendment. 19

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

26 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 27 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 1 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 2 following description of the substance or subject matter of 3 the proposed constitutional amendment:
