1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 16-64-4 of the Code of Alabama

1975, is amended to read as follows:

4 "\$16-64-4.

"(a) Each Alabama public institution of higher education shall charge each undergraduate student who is registered as a nonresident a minimum tuition of two times the resident tuition rate charged by that institution. This rate shall be effective for students who register at an institution beginning August 1, 1997. A nonresident graduate student at an institution shall be charged a rate of tuition that is at least at the level of tuition charged to a nonresident undergraduate.

"(b) The governing boards of each four-year public institution of higher education shall retain the power to extend resident tuition rates to students who reside in any county within 50 miles of a campus of the institution; provided, however, that campus must be in existence and operating as of January 1, 1996. For public two-year institutions, the State Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Chancellor of the Department of Postsecondary Education, shall retain the power to extend resident tuition rates to students who reside in any county within 50 miles of a campus of the institution; provided, however, that campus must be in existence and operating as of January 1, 1996.

1	"(c) The governing boards of each four-year public
2	institution of higher education shall retain the power to
3	extend resident tuition rates, or another rate as determined
4	by the governing board, to nonresident distance learning
5	students who take courses provided by the institution over the
6	Internet. For public two-year institutions, the State Board of
7	Education, upon the recommendation of the Chancellor of the

13	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the

15	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
