18	Section 1. The following amendment to the

21	majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in
22	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution
23	of Alabama of 1901, as amended:
24	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
25	"Amendment 621.
26	"(a) No general law, or state executive order whose
27	purpose or effect is to require a new or increased expenditure

1 of funds held or disbursed by the governing body of a 2 municipality or county, or an instrumentality thereof, or a city or county board of education shall become effective as to 3 any municipality or county, or an instrumentality thereof, or a city or county board of education until approved by an 5 ordinance enacted, or a resolution adopted, by the governing 6 7 authority of the affected municipality, county, or instrumentality, or board of education or until, and only as 8 9 long as, the Legislature appropriates funds for the purpose to the affected municipality, county, or instrumentality, or 10 11 board and only to the extent and amount that the funds are 12 provided, or until a law provides for a local source of 13 revenue within the municipality, county, or instrumentality, 14 or board for the stated purpose and the affected municipality, 15 county, or instrumentality, or board is authorized by ordinance or resolution to levy and collect the revenue and 16 17 only to the extent and amount of the revenue.

- "(b) This amendment shall not apply to:
- "(1) A local law as defined in Article IV, Section 110, Constitution of Alabama 1901.
- "<del>(2) An act, state executive order requiring expenditures by a school board.</del>

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- "(2) (3) An act defining a new crime or amending the definition of an existing crime.
- "(3) (4) An act, statute, executive order enacted, promulgated, or adopted and effective prior to the ratification of this amendment January 6, 1999, which by its

1 provisions requires expenditures by the county or municipality 2 at any time after the effective date of this amendment that 3 date. 4 "(4)  $\frac{(5)}{(5)}$  An act enacted, or state executive order promulgated or adopted to comply with a federal mandate, only 5 to the extent of the federal mandate. 6 7 "(5)  $\frac{(6)}{(6)}$  An act adopted or enacted by two-thirds of those voting in each house of the Legislature and any rule or 8 regulation adopted to implement that act or adopted pursuant 9 10 thereto. "(6) (7) An act determined by the Legislative Fiscal 11 12 Office to have an aggregate insignificant fiscal impact on 13 affected municipalities, counties, or instrumentalities, or 14 boards. For purposes of this subsection, the phrase "aggregate 15 insignificant fiscal impact" shall mean any impact less than \$50,000 annually. 16 17 "(7)  $\frac{(8)}{(8)}$  An act of general application prescribing the minimum compensation for public officials. 18 "(8) An act, statute, administrative rule, or other 19 provision or portion thereof addressing compensation, 20 21 benefits, or due process of any employee of a board education. 22 "(c) For the purposes of this amendment, the phrase 23 board of education shall include the Alabama Institute for 24 Deaf and Blind, the Alabama School of Fine Arts, and the 25 Alabama High School of Mathematics and Science." Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 26 27 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the

Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 1 2 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 3 4 state. Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 5 6 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 7 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of 8 the proposed constitutional amendment: 9 10 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to prohibit a general law, whose purpose or 11 12 effect is to require a new or increased expenditure of at least \$50,000 of local funds annually, from becoming effective 13 14 with regard to a city or county board of education without 15 enactment by a 2/3 vote. "Proposed by Act ." 16 17 This description shall be followed by the following 18 language:
