1 Relating to the Department of Agriculture and 2 Industries; to require the Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Industries to maintain certain records related 3 4 to abandoned and stolen personal property recovered by the department; to authorize the commissioner to sell or destroy 5 6 certain abandoned, stolen, or unclaimed firearms; to authorize 7 the commissioner to sell certain abandoned, stolen, or unclaimed property at a public auction; to provide for notice 8 to owners of property; to provide procedures for the public 9 10 auction; and to provide for the disposition of proceeds from the sale of property. 11

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

13 Section 1. (a) The Commissioner of the Department of 14 Agriculture and Industries shall keep and maintain a permanent record of all abandoned and stolen personal property recovered 15 by the department. These records shall state the description 16 17 of the property, the date of recovery of the property, the serial or other identifying number of the property, and the 18 place of recovery of the property. The records shall be open 19 to public inspection during the department's normal operating 20 21 hours.

(b) All abandoned or stolen property recovered by
the department shall be stored in a suitable place to protect
the property from deterioration.

25 Section 2. If the abandoned and stolen personal 26 property is of a perishable nature and reasonable attempts to 27 locate and identify the owner of the property are not

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1 successful, the property may be sold at once without notice. 2 The commissioner shall attempt to obtain the best possible price for the property. The proceeds of such a sale shall be 3 4 held in a separate account for a period of six months for the owner. During this period, the proceeds shall be paid to the 5 6 owner upon demand, less any cost of recovery, storage, 7 maintenance, and sale. If the proceeds are not claimed within six months, after deducting and paying all expenses incurred 8 9 in the recovery, storage, maintenance, and sale of the property, the net funds shall be paid into the State Treasury 10 to the credit of the Agricultural Fund. 11

12 Section 3. (a) The commissioner shall keep and 13 maintain a separate permanent record of all abandoned and 14 stolen firearms recovered by the department which are not 15 subject to disposition by general law. The records shall state the description of the firearm, the date of recovery of the 16 17 firearm, the serial or other identifying number, if any, of the firearm, and the place of recovery of the firearm. The 18 term "firearm" as used in this act shall have the same meaning 19 as defined in Section 13A-8-1 of the Code of Alabama 1975. 20

(b) Unless otherwise provided by law, the
commissioner may sell or destroy these firearms if the owner
of the firearm does not claim the firearm within six months of
the date the department obtained it.

(c) The commissioner may sell the firearms only to
gun dealers who have held an active business license in this
state for at least one year immediately prior to the date of

the sale. The commissioner shall establish a procedure to notify gun dealers of a sale. A firearm shall be sold to the gun dealer submitting the highest sealed bid. All sales shall be on a cash basis. The proceeds of the sale, after deducting and paying all expenses incurred in the recovery, maintenance, and sale of the firearms shall be paid into the State Treasury to the credit of the Agricultural Fund.

8 (d) The commissioner may establish a procedure to 9 destroy firearms and may expend necessary department funds for 10 that purpose.

Section 4. (a) At least every six months, the commissioner shall sell at public auction to the highest bidder for cash all abandoned or stolen personal property, other than firearms, which has been recovered by the department and has remained unclaimed by the rightful owner during the preceding six-month period.

17 (b) Prior to the sale, notice shall be given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in this 18 state once a week for two successive weeks or by posting a 19 20 notice in a conspicuous place at the Department of Agriculture 21 and Industries' office in Montgomery for a period of at least 22 20 days. The notice shall contain the place, date, and time of 23 each auction and a description of each item of personal 24 property to be sold at the auction. If publication of notice 25 is made in the newspaper, the first notice shall run at least 20 days prior to the auction. 26

1 Section 5. The owner of any abandoned or stolen personal property recovered by the department, including 2 firearms, may claim the property at any time prior to its sale 3 4 by submitting sufficient proof of ownership as determined by the commissioner and by paying any reasonable expenses 5 6 incurred in the recovery of the property, its maintenance, 7 storage, and a pro rata share of the costs, if any, of publication of notice of the sale of the property. 8

9 Section 6. If property is sold at public auction, as 10 provided in this act, a notation in the storage record book 11 shall be made of the sale and of the amount received for the 12 property. The person making the sale may reject any and all 13 bids if the amount bid is unreasonably low and may continue 14 the sale, from time to time, if no bidders are present.

15 Section 7. The proceeds from the sale of property at 16 an auction conducted under the authority of this act, after 17 deducting and paying all expenses incurred in the recovery, 18 storage, maintenance, and sale of property, shall be paid into 19 the State Treasury to the credit of the Agricultural Fund.

20 Section 8. This act shall become effective on the 21 first day of the third month following its passage and 22 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
