## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law, the proceeds the State of Alabama receives from any monetary settlement resulting from the Deep Water Horizon oil spill shall be used to repay any funds transferred from the Alabama Trust Fund, the Education Trust Fund Rainy Day Account, or the General Fund Rainy Day Account to the General Fund or the Education Trust Fund.

(b) Ten percent of any remaining proceeds of the monetary settlement made pursuant to subsection (a) shall be deposited into the Alabama Trust Fund.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
