4	"This article shall be known and may be cited as the
5	Alabama Boxing, Wrestling, and Mixed Martial Arts Act.

3	"(2) BOXING MATCH. A contest between two individuals
4	in which contestants score points in rounds of two or three
5	minutes by striking with gloved fists the head and upper torso
6	of the opponent or by knocking the opponent down and rendering
7	the opponent unconscious or incapable of continuing the
8	contest by the blows, which contest is held in a square ring
9	supervised by a referee and scored by three judges.
10	"(3) BOXING REGISTRY. A registry created or
11	designated pursuant to subsection (k) of Section 41-9-1024.
12	"(4) CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION. An entity described by
13	either of the following:
14	"a. Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of 1986
15	(26 U.S.C. Section 501(c)(3)).
16	"b. Section 170(c), Internal Revenue Code of 1986
17	(26 U.S.C. Section 170(c)).
18	"(5) COMMISSION. <u>The</u> Alabama Athletic Commission.
19	"(6) EXHIBITION. A contest where the participants
20	engage in the use of boxing skills and techniques, tough man
21	skills and techniques, wrestling skills and techniques, or
22	mixed martial arts skills and techniques, or <del>both</del> any or all
23	of these, and where the objective is to display the skills and
24	techniques without striving to win.

"(7) FACE VALUE. The dollar value of a ticket or 1 order shall reflect the dollar amount that the customer shall 2 3 pay in order to view the match, contest, exhibition, or entertainment event. Face value shall include any charges or 4 5 fees, such as dinner, gratuity, parking, surcharges, or any other charges or fees which are charged to and must be paid by 6 7 the customer in order to view the match, contest, exhibition, 8 or entertainment event. It shall exclude any portion paid by the customer for federal, state, or local taxes. 9

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"(8) GROSS RECEIPTS. Any of the following:

"a. The gross price charged for the sale or lease of broadcasting, television, closed circuit, or motion picture rights without any deductions for commissions, brokerage fees, distribution fees, production fees, advertising, or other expenses or charges.

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"b. The face value of all tickets sold.

"(9) MANAGER. A person who, under contract, agreement, or other arrangement with a boxer or a mixed martial arts competitor, undertakes to control or administer, directly or indirectly, a matter on behalf of a boxer or a mixed martial arts competitor. The term includes, but is not limited to, a person who functions as a booking agent, adviser, or consultant.

24 "(10) MATCHMAKER. A person who is employed by or
 25 associated with a promoter in the capacity of booking and

arranging professional matches, contests, or exhibitions of boxing or mixed martial arts between opponents or who proposes professional matches, contests, or exhibitions of boxing or mixed martial arts and selects and arranges for the participants in such events and for whose activities in this regard the promoter is legally responsible.

"(11) MIXED MARTIAL ARTS. Unarmed combat involving
the use of any combination of techniques from different
disciplines of the martial arts, including, without
limitation, grappling, submission holds, throws, and striking
or kicking with the hands, feet, knees, or elbows. The term
mixed martial arts includes kickboxing.

13 "(12) PERSON. An individual, partnership, firm, 14 association, corporation, or combination of individuals of 15 whatever form or character.

16 "(13) PHYSICIAN. A doctor of medicine or doctor of 17 osteopathy licensed to practice medicine in the State of 18 Alabama.

19 "(14) PROFESSIONAL. A person who is participating or 20 has participated in a match, contest, or exhibition of boxing<u></u> 21 <u>wrestling</u>, or mixed martial arts which is not governed or 22 authorized by one or more of the organizations listed in 23 subdivision (1) and any of the following:

24 "a. Has received or competed for or is receiving or25 competing for any cash as a salary, purse, or prize for

participating in any match, contest, or exhibition of boxing,
 wrestling, or mixed martial arts.

3 "b. Is participating or has participated in any 4 match, contest, or exhibition of boxing<u>, wrestling</u>, or mixed 5 martial arts to which admission is granted upon payment of any 6 ticket for admission or other evidence of the right of entry.

7 "c. Is participating or has participated in any
8 match, contest, or exhibition of boxing, wrestling, or mixed
9 martial arts which is or was filmed, broadcast, or transmitted
10 for viewing.

"d. Is participating or has participated in any match, contest, or exhibition of boxing<u>, wrestling</u>, or mixed martial arts which provides a commercial advantage by attracting persons to a particular place or promoting a commercial product or enterprise.

16 "(15) PROFESSIONAL MATCH, CONTEST, or EXHIBITION OF
 17 BOXING, WRESTLING, or MIXED MARTIAL ARTS.

18 "a. A boxing match, contest, or exhibition<del>,; a</del> 19 <u>wrestling match;</u> or a mixed martial arts match, contest, or 20 exhibition, which is not governed or authorized by one or more 21 of the organizations listed in subdivision (1) and which does 22 any of the following:

"1. Rewards a boxer, wrestler, or mixed martial arts
competitor participating with cash as a salary, purse, or
prize for such participation.

"2. Requires for admission payment of a ticket or 1 other evidence of the right of entry. 2 3 "3. Is filmed, broadcast, or transmitted for 4 viewing. 5 "4. Provides a commercial advantage by attracting 6 persons to a particular place or promoting a commercial product or enterprise. 7 8 "b. The term does not include unarmed combat. 9 "(16) PROFESSIONAL WRESTLING. Any organized event 10 between two unarmed contestants in which participants compete primarily for the purpose of providing entertainment to 11 12 spectators that may or may not comprise a bona fide athletic 13 contest or competition. 14 "(16)(17) PROMOTER. The person primarily responsible for organizing, promoting, and producing a professional match, 15 16 contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough man 17 contest, professional wrestling, or mixed martial arts and who is legally responsible for the lawful conduct of such 18 19 professional match, contest, or exhibition of boxing or mixed martial arts. 20

21 "(17)(18) PURSE or RING EARNINGS. The financial 22 guarantee or any other remuneration, or part thereof, which a 23 professional boxer, wrestler, or mixed martial arts competitor 24 participating in a match, contest, or exhibition will receive

3	"(19) TOUGH MAN CONTEST. A boxing match and
4	tournament where each contestant wears headgear and oversized

7	"(a) There is created the Alabama Athletic
8	Commission composed of five <u>six</u> members.
9	"(b)(1) The membership of the commission shall be
10	inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic,
11	urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state. The $\frac{five}{five}$
12	initial members shall be as follows:
13	"a. Two members appointed by the Governor.
14	"b. One member appointed by the Alabama Athlete
15	Agents Commission.
16	"c. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House
17	of Representatives.
18	"d. One member appointed by the President of the
19	Senate.
20	"e. One member appointed by the President Pro

10 "(c) The commission shall elect a chair from among 11 its membership for a term of one year. While serving as chair, 12 a member may not vote on any matter coming before the 13 commission. The commission may elect a vice chair from its 14 membership for a term of one year. Any member serving as chair 15 shall be eligible for successive election to the office by the 16 commission. The chair may designate another member of the commission to perform the duties of chair in his or her 17 18 absence. The commission may employ an executive director to 19 manage the day-to-day operations of the commission within the available funds of the commission. 20

"(d) A medical advisory panel of the commission shall be appointed by the Governor and shall consist of four persons licensed to practice medicine in this state, representing the specialties of neurology, ophthalmology, sports medicine, and general medicine. The medical advisory

panel shall advise and assist the commission and its staff 1 2 regarding issues and questions concerning the medical safety 3 of professional boxers, tough man contestants, professional wrestlers, amateur mixed martial arts competitors, and 4 5 professional mixed martial arts competitors, including, but not limited to, matters relating to medical suspensions. The 6 medical advisory panel may meet separately from the commission 7 8 to discuss and formulate recommendations for the commission in connection with medical safety. Members of the medical 9 10 advisory panel shall not be counted in determining a quorum of the commission and shall not vote as commission members. 11

"(e) Each member of the commission and the medical advisory panel shall be reimbursed for expenses and travel as provided for public officials of this state.

16 "(a)(1) The commission shall be the sole regulator 17 of professional boxing in this state and shall have authority 18 to protect the physical safety and welfare of professional 19 boxers and serve the public interest by closely supervising 20 all professional boxing in this state.

"(2) The commission shall be the sole regulator of professional <u>and amateur</u> matches, contests, or exhibitions of mixed martial arts and shall have the authority to protect the physical safety and welfare of professional competitors in mixed martial arts and serve the public interest by closely supervising all professional competitors in mixed martial arts. The commission shall regulate professional and amateur mixed martial arts to the same extent as professional boxing unless any rule of the commission is not by its nature applicable to mixed martial arts.

"(3) Commencing on the effective date of the act 6 amending this subdivision, the The commission shall have the 7 8 sole authority to license an amateur mixed martial arts 9 sanctioning organization to safequard the public health, to 10 protect competitors, and to provide for competitive matches by 11 requiring each licensed organization to abide by rules 12 promulgated by the commission. be the sole regulator of 13 professional matches, contests, or exhibitions of wrestling and shall have the authority to protect the physical safety 14 15 and welfare of professional competitors in professional 16 wrestling and serve the public interest by closely supervising 17 all competitors in professional wrestling. The commission 18 shall regulate professional wrestling to the same extent as 19 professional boxing unless any rule of the commission is not by its nature applicable to professional wrestling. 20 "(4) The commission shall have the sole authority to 21 22 license a wrestling sanctioning organization to safeguard the 23 public health, to protect competitors, and to provide for competitive matches by requiring each licensed organization to 24 abide by rules promulgated by the commission. The commission, 25

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1	at the request of a licensed sanctioning organization, may
2	provide direct oversight of any event sanctioned by the
3	organization for a fee negotiated between the commission and
4	the licensed sanctioning organization.
5	" <u>(5) The commission shall have the sole authority to</u>
6	license the promoters of tough man contests to safeguard the
7	public health, to protect competitors, and to provide for
8	competitive matches by requiring each licensed promoter to
9	abide by rules promulgated by the commission. The commission,
10	at the request of a promoter, may provide direct oversight of
11	any tough man match for a fee negotiated between the
12	commission and the promoter.
13	"(b) The commission shall have the sole jurisdiction
14	to license the promotion or holding of each <del>professional</del>
15	match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough
16	man contests, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial
17	arts, or professional mixed martial arts promoted or held
18	within this state.
19	"(c) The commission shall have the authority to
20	license participants in any <del>professional</del> match, contest, or
21	exhibition of professional boxing, professional wrestling,
22	amateur mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts
23	held in this state.

"(d) The commission shall have the authority to
direct, manage, control, and supervise all professional

matches, contests, or exhibitions of professional boxing, 1 tough man contests, professional wrestling, amateur mixed 2 3 martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts including, but not limited to, the authority to enforce safety measures 4 5 and restrict access to certain areas for the protection of the public and participants. The commission. It may adopt bylaws 6 7 for its own management and promulgate and enforce rules and 8 regulations consistent with this article.

"(e) The commission shall have the sole authority to 9 10 inquire into the plans or arrangements for compliance of a 11 licensed organization with rules promulgated by the 12 commission. The commission may require an amateur mixed 13 martial arts organization a wrestling sanctioning organization 14 to pay an annual licensure fee and any other fee determined 15 necessary by the board and may penalize any organization for 16 violation of this article or any rule promulgated by the 17 commission pursuant to this article.

18 "(f) The commission may appoint one or more 19 inspectors as duly authorized representatives of the 20 commission to ensure that the rules are strictly observed. The 21 inspectors shall be present at all professional matches, 22 contests, or exhibitions of boxing, wrestling, or mixed 23 martial arts.

"(g) The commission may designate physicians as duly
 authorized representatives of the commission to conduct

1	physical examinations of boxers or mixed martial arts
2	competitors licensed under this article and shall designate a
3	roster of physicians authorized to conduct prefight physicals
4	and serve as ringside physicians in all professional boxing $_{\scriptstyle \! L}$
5	tough man, or mixed martial arts matches held in this state.
6	"(h)(1) The commission or any agent duly designated
7	by the commission may do any of the following:
8	"a. Make investigations.
9	"b. Hold hearings.
10	"c. Issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of
11	witnesses and the production of books, papers, and records.
12	"d. Administer oaths to and examine any witnesses
13	for the purpose of determining any question coming before it
14	under this article or under the rules and regulations adopted
15	pursuant to this article.
16	" <u>e. Swear out a warrant of arrest against any person</u>
17	violating the criminal provisions of this article, and the
18	commission shall not be liable in damages or to any action for
19	damages by reason of swearing out a warrant or for causing the
20	arrest and detention or imprisonment of any person under such
21	warrant, unless the commission or agent fails to act in a
22	reasonably prudent manner.
23	"(2) During an investigation of any allegation
24	which, if proven, would result in criminal or civil sanctions
25	as provided in this article, the commission may withhold all

or a portion of the gross receipts to which the person under investigation is entitled until such time as the matter has been resolved.

"(i) The commission may engage in activities which 4 5 promote amateur boxing, amateur wrestling, and amateur mixed martial arts in this state and contract with any nonprofit 6 7 organization which is exempted from the taxation of income. To 8 support amateur boxing, amateur wrestling, and amateur mixed martial arts in this state, the commission may promote 9 10 voluntary contributions through the application process or 11 through any fund-raising or other promotional technique deemed 12 appropriate by the commission.

13 "(j) Pursuant to 15 U.S.C. Section 6301, et seq., 14 the commission may issue to each boxer who is a resident of 15 this state an identification card bearing the photograph of 16 the boxer and in such form and containing such information as 17 the commission deems necessary and appropriate. The commission 18 shall ensure that the form and manner of issuance of the 19 identification cards comply with any applicable federal law or 20 regulation. The commission may charge an amount not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) per card for the issuance or 21 22 replacement of each identification card.

"(k) The commission may create a boxing registry or
 designate a nationally recognized boxing registry and register

each boxer who is a resident of this state or who is a 1 2 resident of another state which has no boxing registry. 3 "(1) The commission may inquire into the financial backing of any professional match, contest, or exhibition of 4 5 boxing, wrestling, or mixed martial arts and obtain answers to written or oral questions propounded to all persons associated 6 with the professional event. 7 8 "(m) The commission, pursuant to rule, may license any concessionaire, ring announcer, photographer, or other 9 10 person receiving any portion of the gate proceeds from a match, contest, or exhibition held in the state pursuant to 11 12 this article. 13 "\$41-9-1025. 14 "The commission shall designate a person to serve as 15 secretary executive director and the secretary executive 16 director shall issue licenses and identification cards and 17 perform other duties as the commission may direct in the 18 enforcement of this article. "§41-9-1027. 19 "The commission shall adopt rules and regulations 20 21 governing professional boxing, tough man contests, amateur 22 mixed martial arts, and professional mixed martial arts to 23 establish the following: "(1) Procedures to evaluate the professional records 24 25 and physician certifications of each boxer participating in a

professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough man contests, amateur mixed martial arts, and professional mixed martial arts and to deny authorization for a professional boxer, tough man contestant, amateur mixed martial arts competitor, or professional mixed martial arts competitor to fight where appropriate.

"(2) Procedures to ensure that, except as otherwise 7 8 provided in subsection (c) of Section 41-9-1032, no professional boxer, amateur mixed martial arts competitor, or 9 10 professional mixed martial arts competitor shall be permitted to box participate while under suspension from any state 11 boxing or athletic commission because of any of the following: 12 13 "a. A recent knockout, technical knockout, or series 14 of consecutive losses. 15 "b. An injury, requirement for a medical procedure, 16 or physician's denial of certification. 17 "c. Failure of a drug test. 18 "d. The use of false aliases or falsifying official 19 identification cards or document. 20 "e. Other reasons as determined by the commission. 21 "(3) Procedures to report to the boxing registry the

results of all professional matches, contests, or exhibitions of boxing held in this state or being supervised by the commission and any related suspensions.

"A member or employee of the commission and any 1 person who administers or enforces this article or rules 2 3 promulgated in accordance with this article shall not be a member of, contract with, or receive any compensation from any 4 5 person or organization who authorizes, arranges, or promotes professional matches, contests, or exhibitions of professional 6 boxing, tough man contests, professional wrestling, amateur 7 8 mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts or who otherwise has a financial interest in any activity or licensee 9 10 regulated by the commission. The term compensation does not 11 include funds held in escrow for payment to another person in 12 connection with a professional match, contest, or exhibition 13 of boxing, wrestling, or mixed martial arts.

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"§41-9-1029.

"(a)(1) No person shall promote or hold a
professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional
boxing, tough man contests, professional wrestling, amateur
mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts within
this state without first applying for and obtaining a
promoter's license from the commission.

"(2) Licenses shall be issued annually and shall
expire on December 31 of each calendar year.

"(b) Promoters shall apply to the commission for a
license required by subsection (a) on a form provided by the
commission. The application shall be accompanied by a

nonrefundable fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars 1 2 (\$250). The application shall also be accompanied by a 3 performance bond in an amount and under any conditions required by the commission. To qualify for a promoter's 4 5 license, an applicant shall be a citizen of the United States 6 or, if not a citizen of the United States, a person who is legally present in the United States with appropriate 7 8 documentation from the federal government.

"(c)(1) In addition to the license required by 9 10 subsection (a), a professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough man contests, professional 11 wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or professional mixed 12 13 martial arts within this state shall not be staged unless a 14 match permit has been issued by the commission for the 15 professional match, contest, or exhibition of boxing or mixed 16 martial arts.

"(2) Each application for a match permit shall be on a form provided by the commission and shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250). The commission may charge an additional match fee in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the commission.

"(d) The commission may, prior to issuing any match permit, may require a performance bond in addition to that required in subsection (b).

"(e) The commission may refund any portion of the 1 match permit fee in excess of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) 2 3 to any person who paid the excess fee if the professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough 4 5 man contests, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts for which the fees 6 were paid is not held. 7 8 "(f) A licensed amateur mixed martial arts 9 sanctioning organization shall provide written notice to the 10 commission at least 15 calendar days before the date of each match, contest, or exhibition authorized and governed by the 11 organization. The licensed amateur mixed martial arts 12 13 sanctioning organization governing the match, contest, or 14 exhibition shall provide to the commission all of the 15 following information regarding the match, contest, or 16 exhibition: 17 "(1) The names and other relevant information relating to the contestants. 18 19 "(2) The venue. "(3) The rules of the competition. 20 21 "(4) The anticipated level of physical conditioning 22 and training of the contestants. 23 "(5) Any other information deemed necessary by the

24 <del>commission.</del>

"(g) (f) The commission shall have the sole authority 1 to certify the results of each amateur mixed martial arts 2 3 match, contest, or exhibition held within the state. The results shall be submitted to the commission not later than 4 three calendar days after the match, contest, or exhibition. A 5 match may not be certified by the commission until all 6 information required by the commission is provided to the 7 8 commission.

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"§41-9-1030.

10 "(a) Prior to participating in a professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, professional 11 wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or professional mixed 12 13 martial arts supervised by the commission, referees, judges, 14 timekeepers, matchmakers, boxers, wrestlers, mixed martial arts competitors, managers, trainers, and each person who 15 16 assists a boxer, wrestler, or mixed martial arts competitor 17 immediately before and after a match, contest, or exhibition of boxing, wrestling, or mixed martial arts and between rounds 18 19 during a match, contest, or exhibition of boxing, wrestling, 20 or mixed martial arts shall be required by the commission to 21 apply for and be issued a license. Licenses shall be issued 22 annually and shall expire on December 31 of each calendar 23 year. Each applicant shall make application on a form provided 24 by the commission and pay an annual license fee not to exceed 25 two hundred fifty dollars (\$250).

"(b) The nonrefundable initial licensing fee and 1 2 annual renewal fee for an amateur mixed martial arts a 3 professional wrestling sanctioning organization may not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000). 4 5 "(c) The commission shall issue a license under this 6 section only if: "(1) The commission has determined to the best of 7 8 its ability that the applicant has the training or skills 9 necessary to perform in a manner appropriate to the license. 10 "(2) The applicant has complied with all applicable requirements of this article and any rules and regulations 11 promulgated pursuant to this article. 12 13 "(3) The commission or its designated representative 14 has determined from information provided by the applicant and 15 from any medical evaluation required by the commission that 16 the health, welfare, and physical safety of the applicant will 17 not be unduly jeopardized by the issuance of the license. "(4) The applicant is a citizen of the United States 18 19 or, if not a citizen of the United States, a person who is 20 legally present in the United States with appropriate 21 documentation from the federal government. 22 "§41-9-1031. 23 "(a) In addition to the license required in Section 24 41-9-1030, each professional boxer, amateur mixed martial arts

25 <u>competitor, or professional mixed martial arts competitor</u> who

is a resident of this state or another state which has no
state boxing <u>or athletic</u> commission shall register with a
boxing, <u>amateur mixed martial arts</u>, <u>or professional mixed</u>
<u>martial arts</u> registry created or designated by the commission
and renew his or her registration as prescribed by rules of
the commission.

"(b) At the time of registration and renewal, the 7 8 boxer , amateur mixed martial arts competitor, or professional 9 mixed martial arts competitor shall provide the boxing 10 registry with a recent photograph of the boxer licensee and the Social Security number of the boxer licensee or, in the 11 case of a foreign boxer licensee, any similar citizen 12 13 identification number or boxer licensee number from the 14 country of residence of the boxer licensee, along with any other information the commission requires. The boxing registry 15 16 registries shall issue a personal identification number to 17 each boxer licensee and the number shall appear on the identification card issued to the boxer licensee as a result 18 19 of registration. Each boxer licensee shall present to the boxing commission an identification card issued by the state 20 in which he or she resides not later than the time of the 21 22 weigh-in for a professional match, contest, or exhibition.

"(c) The commission may charge a registration fee in
an amount calculated to cover the administrative expense of
the registration.

1 "§41-9-1032.

"(a) The commission may refuse to grant a license to 2 3 an applicant upon a finding by a majority of the entire commission that the applicant has failed to demonstrate the 4 5 qualifications or standards for a license contained in this section or under the laws, rules, and regulations under which 6 licensure is sought. The applicant shall demonstrate to the 7 8 satisfaction of the commission that he or she meets all the requirements for the issuance of a license, and, if the 9 10 commission is not satisfied as to the qualifications of the 11 applicant, it may deny a license without a prior hearing; however, the applicant shall be allowed to appear before the 12 13 commission if he or she so desires.

14 "(b)(1) The commission, by majority vote, after 15 prior notice to the holder of a license and after affording 16 such a holder an opportunity to be heard, may fine the license 17 holder, revoke or suspend the license, or take other 18 disciplinary action against the licensee upon the 19 recommendation of any officially designated representative for reasons involving the medical or physical safety of any 20 21 professional boxer, tough man contestant, amateur mixed 22 martial arts competitor, or professional mixed martial arts 23 competitor licensed by the commission, summarily suspend any license previously issued by the commission or take other 24 25 disciplinary action against any licensee. The licensee shall,

after the summary suspension, be afforded an opportunity to be heard, in accordance with the rules of the commission and the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act. A summary suspension imposed against such a licensee may include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

"a. Prohibiting any professional boxer, tough man
contestant, amateur mixed martial arts competitor, or
professional mixed martial arts competitor from competing,
appearing in, or participating in any professional match,
contest, or exhibition within 60 days of having suffered a
knockout.

12 "b. Prohibiting any professional boxer, amateur 13 <u>mixed martial arts competitor, or professional mixed martial</u> 14 <u>arts competitor, from competing, appearing in, or</u> 15 participating in any professional match, contest, or 16 exhibition within 30 days of having suffered a technical 17 knockout where evidence of head trauma has been determined by 18 the attending ringside physician.

"(2) The length of any summary suspension invoked pursuant to this subsection, upon the recommendation of the ringside physician, may be extended to any number of days. The terms and conditions of the suspension or revocation may require that the boxer submit to further medical evaluation as determined by the ringside physician.

"(c) The commission, its secretary executive 1 2 director, or its duly authorized representative, at any time 3 prior to the completion of a permitted professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, a tough man 4 5 contest, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts, may summarily suspend or 6 revoke the match permit or the license of any specific boxer, 7 8 wrestler, or mixed martial arts competitor should it be determined by such person that the continuation of the 9 10 professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or 11 professional mixed martial arts may jeopardize the health, 12 13 welfare, morals, or safety of the citizens of this state or 14 may jeopardize the health or personal safety of any 15 participant of the professional match, contest, or exhibition 16 of professional boxing, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts; provided, 17 however, that the licensee shall, after a summary suspension, 18 19 shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard, in accordance with the rules of the commission and the Alabama 20 Administrative Procedure Act. 21

"(d) The commission may revoke a suspension of a
professional boxer, professional wrestler, amateur mixed
martial arts competitor, or professional mixed martial arts
<u>competitor</u> if any of the following applies:

1 "(1) The professional boxer, professional wrestler, 2 or mixed martial arts competitor was suspended pursuant to 3 rules and regulations adopted pursuant to Section 41-9-1027 4 and has furnished proof of a sufficiently improved medical or 5 physical condition.

"(2) The professional boxer, professional wrestler,
or mixed martial arts competitor furnishes proof that a
suspension pursuant to Section 41-9-1027 was not or is no
longer merited by the facts.

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"§41-9-1033.

"No person shall arrange, promote, organize, produce, or participate in a professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts unless he or she has complied with the following requirements:

16 "(1) An examination by a physician who has certified 17 that the boxer or mixed martial arts competitor is physically 18 fit to compete safely. Copies of each certificate shall be 19 provided to the commission prior to the professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, amateur mixed 20 21 martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts. The 22 commission may require a boxer, tough man contestant, 23 wrestler, or mixed martial arts competitor to undergo a physical examination, including neurological or 24 25 neuropsychological tests and procedures.

"(2) A physician approved by the commission shall be 1 2 continuously present at ringside during every professional 3 match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough man contest, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial 4 5 arts, or professional mixed martial arts. The physician shall observe the physical condition of the boxers, tough man 6 7 contestants, wrestlers, or competitors in mixed martial arts 8 and advise the referee with regard to the boxers, tough man 9 contestants, wrestlers, or competitors.

10 "(3) One or more inspectors appointed by the 11 commission as duly authorized representatives of the commission shall be present at each professional match, 12 13 contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough man contests, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, 14 15 or professional mixed martial arts to ensure that the rules 16 are strictly observed. An inspector or other duly authorized 17 representative of the commission shall be present at the 18 weigh-in and at the ring during the conduct of the 19 professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, amateur mixed <u>martial arts</u>, or <u>professional</u> mixed 20 21 martial arts. Inspectors and other duly authorized 22 representatives of the commission shall have free access to 23 the dressing rooms of the professional boxers, tough man 24 contestants, and mixed martial arts competitors.

"(4) Each boxer, tough man contestant, wrestler, or 1 competitor in mixed martial arts shall be covered by health 2 3 insurance which will cover injuries sustained during the professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional 4 5 boxing, tough man contest, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts. 6 "(5) An ambulance and medical personnel with 7 8 appropriate resuscitation equipment shall be continuously 9 present at the site during any professional match, contest, or 10 exhibition of professional boxing, tough man contest, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or 11 12 professional mixed martial arts. 13 "\$41-9-1034. 14 "It shall be unlawful for any professional boxer, 15 tough man contestant, professional wrestler, amateur mixed 16 martial arts competitor, or professional competitor in mixed 17 martial arts to participate or attempt to participate in a 18 professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough man contest, professional wrestling, amateur 19 mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts while 20 21 under the influence of alcohol or any drug. A professional 22 boxer, tough man contestant, professional wrestler, amateur 23 mixed martial arts competitor, or professional mixed martial arts competitor shall be deemed under the influence of alcohol 24

25 or a drug for the purposes of this section if a physical

examination made during a period of time beginning not more 1 2 than six hours prior to the beginning of the professional 3 match, contest, or exhibition of boxing, wrestling, or mixed martial arts and ending not more than one hour after the 4 5 completion of the professional match, contest, or exhibition of boxing or mixed martial arts reveals that the mental or 6 physical ability of the professional boxer, tough man 7 8 contestant, professional wrestler, amateur mixed martial arts competitor, or professional mixed martial arts competitor is 9 10 impaired as a direct result of the use of alcohol or a drug. 11 "§41-9-1035.

12 "All buildings or structures used or intended to be 13 used for holding or giving professional matches, contests, or 14 exhibitions of professional boxing, tough man contest, 15 professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts, or 16 professional mixed martial arts shall be safe and shall in all 17 manner conform to the laws, ordinances, and regulations 18 pertaining to buildings in the municipality or unincorporated 19 area of the county where the building or structure is situated. 20

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"§41-9-1036.

"No person under the age of 18 years shall
participate as a contestant in any professional match,
contest, or exhibition of professional boxing, tough man

1	contest, professional wrestling, amateur mixed martial arts,
2	or <u>professional</u> mixed martial arts.

4	"The commission shall have jurisdiction over any
5	professional match, contest, or exhibition of professional
6	boxing, tough man contests, professional wrestling, amateur
7	mixed martial arts, or professional mixed martial arts which
8	occurs or is held within this state, is filmed in this state,
9	or is broadcast or transmitted from this state.
10	"§41-9-1038.
11	"(a) The Attorney General may bring a civil action
12	requesting relief, including a permanent or temporary
13	injunction, restraining order, or other order, against any
14	person who he or she believes is violating Sections 41-9-1029,
15	41-9-1030, 41-9-1031, 41-9-1032, 41-9-1033, 41-9-1034,
16	41-9-1035, and 41-9-1037.
17	"(b)(1) Any manager, promoter, matchmaker, or
18	licensee who knowingly violates or coerces or causes any other
19	person to violate Sections 41-9-1030, 41-9-1031, 41-9-1032,
20	41-9-1033, 41-9-1034, 41-9-1035, 41-9-1036, and 41-9-1037
21	shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a Class C felony.
22	"(2) Any member or employee of the commission or any
23	person who administers or enforces this article or rules and
24	regulations promulgated pursuant to this article who knowingly

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violates Sections 41-9-1033 or 41-9-1034 shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a Class C felony. 2

3 "(3) Any professional boxer, tough man contestant, professional wrestler, amateur mixed martial arts competitor, 4 5 or professional competitor in mixed martial arts who knowingly violates this article, except Section 41-9-1034, shall, upon 6 conviction, be quilty of a Class B misdemeanor. 7

8 "(4) Any professional boxer, tough man contestant, professional wrestler, amateur mixed martial arts competitor, 9 10 or professional competitor in mixed martial arts who violates 11 Section 41-9-1034 may be punished by a civil fine not to 12 exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) together with a 13 percentage of the purse not to exceed 15 percent for each 14 violation.

15 "(c) A person who participates in or promotes 16 unarmed combat shall be quilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

17 "(d) The criminal penalties in this section shall 18 not be construed to repeal other criminal laws. Whenever 19 conduct prescribed by this article is also prescribed by other provision of law, the provision which carries the more serious 20 21 penalty shall be applied."

22 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its 23 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 24 25 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now

appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

5 Section 3. This act shall become effective 6 immediately following its passage and approval by the 7 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
