1 "No incorporated municipality shall have the power 2 to enact any ordinance, rule, or regulation which shall tax, restrict, prevent, or in any way affect the possession or 3 4 ownership of handguns or rifles by the citizens of this state. The entire subject matter of handguns and rifles is reserved 5 to the State Legislature. This section shall not be construed 6 7 to limit or restrict the power of a municipality to adopt ordinances which make the violation of a state handgun law or 8 a violation of a state law relating to rifles a violation of a 9 10 municipal ordinance to the same extent as other state law violations, or to limit or restrict the power of a municipal 11 12 court to exercise concurrent jurisdiction with the district 13 court over violations of state handgun laws or violations of 14 state laws relating to rifles which may be prosecuted as breaches of a municipal ordinance." 15

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 17 first day of the third month following its passage and 18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
