3	"§34-9-1.
4	"For the purposes of this chapter, the following
5	terms shall have the respective meanings ascribed by this
6	section:
7	"(1) ANNUAL REGISTRATION. The documentary evidence
8	that the board has renewed the authority of the licensee to
9	practice dentistry or dental hygiene in this state.
10	"(2) BOARD. The Board of Dental Examiners of
11	Alabama.
12	"(3) COMMERCIAL DENTAL LABORATORY. A technician or
13	group of technicians available to any or all licensed dentists
14	for construction or repair of dental appliances.
15	"(4) EXPANDED DUTY DENTAL ASSISTANT. A dental
16	assistant who holds a current expanded license certificate
17	from the board.
18	" (4) (5) GENERAL ANESTHESIA. A controlled state of
19	unconsciousness, accompanied by a partial or complete loss of
20	protective reflexes, including inability to independently
21	maintain an airway and respond purposefully to physical
22	stimulation or verbal command, produced by a pharmacologic
23	method.

"(5)(6) LICENSE. The grant of authority by the board 1 2 to a person to engage in the practice of dentistry or dental 3 hygiene. "(6)(7) LICENSE CERTIFICATE. The documentary 4 5 evidence under seal of the board that said the board has 6 granted authority to the licensee to practice dentistry or dental hygiene in this state. 7 8 "(7) LICENSED DENTIST. A dentist who holds a current license certificate from the board. 9 10 "(8) LICENSED HYGIENIST. A hygienist who holds a current license certificate from the board. 11 "(9) LOCAL ANESTHESIA. The elimination of 12 13 sensations, especially pain in one part of the body by topical 14 application or regional injection of a drug. 15 "(10) PRACTICE OF DENTISTRY ACROSS STATE LINES. 16 "a. The practice of dentistry as defined in Section 17 34-9-6 as it applies to the following: 18 "1. The rendering of a written or otherwise 19 documented professional opinion concerning the diagnosis or treatment of a patient located within this state by a dentist 20 located outside this state as a result of transmission of 21 22 individual patient data by electronic or other means from 23 within this state to the dentist or his or her agent. 24 "2. The rendering of treatment to a patient located 25 within this state by a dentist located outside this state as a result of transmission of individual patient data by
 electronic or other means from this state to the dentist or
 his or her agent.

4 "3. The holding of himself or herself out as
5 qualified to practice dentistry, or use any title, word, or
6 abbreviation to indicate or induce others to believe that he
7 or she is licensed to practice dentistry across state lines.

8 "b. This definition is not intended to include an informal consultation between a licensed dentist located in 9 this state and a dentist located outside this state provided 10 11 that the consultation is conducted without compensation or the 12 expectation of compensation to either dentist, and does not 13 result in the formal rendering of a written or otherwise 14 documented professional opinion concerning the diagnosis or 15 treatment of a patient by the dentist located outside the 16 state.

17 "(11)(11) PRIVATE TECHNICIANS. A technician employed
18 by a dentist or group of dentists for a specified salary.

19 "(12)(12) SEDATION. A depressed level of 20 consciousness that retains the patient's ability to 21 independently and continuously maintain an airway and respond 22 appropriately to physical stimulation or verbal command, 23 produced by a pharmacologic method.

1	"It shall be unlawful for any person to practice
2	dental hygiene <u>or expanded duty dental assisting</u> in the State
3	of Alabama, except:
4	"(1) Those who are now licensed dental hygienists <u>or</u>
5	licensed expanded duty dental assistants, pursuant to law; and
6	"(2) Those who may hereafter be duly licensed and
7	who are currently registered as dental hygienists <u>or expanded</u>
8	duty dental assistants pursuant to the provisions of this
9	chapter.
10	"§34-9-6.
11	"Any person shall be deemed to be practicing
12	dentistry who does any of the following:
13	"(1) Performs, or attempts or professes to perform,
14	any dental operation or dental service of any kind,
15	gratuitously or for a salary, fee, money or other remuneration
16	paid, or to be paid, directly or indirectly, to himself or
17	herself, or to any person in his or her behalf, or to any
18	agency which is a proprietor of a place where dental
19	operations or dental services are performed.
20	"(2) Directly or indirectly, by any means or method,
21	makes impression of the human tooth, teeth, jaws or adjacent
22	tissue, or performs any phase of any operation incident to the
23	replacement of a tooth or any part thereof.
24	"(3) Supplies artificial substitutes for the natural
25	teeth, and who furnishes, supplies, constructs, reproduces, or

1 repairs any prosthesis (fixed or removable), appliance, or any 2 other structure to be worn in the human mouth.

"(4) Places such appliance or structure in the human
mouth, or adjusts, attempts, or professes to adjust the same,
or delivers the same to any person other than the dentist upon
whose prescription the work was performed.

"(5) Professes to the public by any method to 7 8 furnish, supply, construct, reproduce, or repair any 9 prosthesis (fixed or removable), appliance, or other structure 10 to be worn in the human mouth, or who diagnoses, or professes to diagnose, prescribe for, professes to prescribe for, treats 11 or professes to treat disease, pain, deformity, deficiency, 12 13 injury, or physical condition of the human teeth or jaws, or 14 adjacent structure, or who extracts or attempts to extract human teeth, or remove tumors, abnormal growths, or other 15 16 lesions from the human gums, jaws, and adjacent structures, or who operates for cleft lip or palate, or both; or who treats 17 surgically or mechanically fractures of the human jaw; or who 18 19 administers local or general anesthetics in the treatment of 20 any dental lesion.

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"(6) Repairs or fills cavities in the human teeth.

"(7) Uses a roentgen, radiograph, or digital imaging
machine for the purpose of making dental roentgenograms,
radiographs, or digital images, or who gives, or professes to
give, interpretations or readings of dental roentgenograms,

radiographs, or digital images, or radiographic or roentgen
 therapy.

3 "(8) Administers an anesthetic of any nature in4 connection with a dental procedure.

5 "(9) Uses the words "dentist," "dental surgeon," 6 "oral surgeon," or the letters "D.D.S.," "D.M.D." or any other 7 words, letters, title, or descriptive matter which in any way 8 represents him or her as being able to diagnose, treat, 9 prescribe, or operate for any disease, pain, deformity, 10 deficiency, injury, or physical condition of the teeth or 11 jaws, or adjacent structures.

"(10) States, or professes, or permits to be stated or professed by any means or method whatsoever that he or she can perform or will attempt to perform dental procedures, or render a diagnosis connected therewith.

16 "(11) Performs any clinical operation included in 17 the curricula of recognized dental colleges; provided, that members of the faculty, teachers, instructors, fellows, 18 19 interns, residents, dental students, and student dental 20 hygienists, and student expanded duty dental assistants who 21 are employed by or who are taking courses or instructions at 22 the University of Alabama School of Dentistry or such other 23 dental colleges, hospitals, or institutions in Alabama, as may 24 be approved by the board; and provided, that the work of 25 fellows, interns, residents, dental students, and student

dental hygienists is performed within the facilities of such 1 2 dental colleges, hospitals, and institutions under the 3 supervision of an instructor and as an adjunct to his or her course of study or training, shall not be required to take 4 examination or obtain a license certificate and renewal 5 license certificate when all of such work, dental procedures, 6 and activities are confined to his or her work in the college, 7 8 hospital, or other institution and the work is done without remuneration other than the regular salary or compensation 9 10 paid by such colleges, hospitals, or other institutions.

"(12) Professes to the public by any method to bleach human teeth, performs bleaching of the human teeth alone or within his or her business, or instructs the public within his or her business, or through any agent or employee of his or her business, in the use of any tooth bleaching product.

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"§34-9-7.

18 "Nothing in this chapter shall apply to the19 following practices, acts, and operations:

"(1) The practice of his or her profession by a physician or surgeon holding a certificate of qualification as a medical doctor and licensed as such under the laws of this state, provided he or she shall not practice dentistry as a specialty.

"(2) The practice of dentistry in the discharge of 1 their official duties by graduate dentists or dental surgeons 2 3 in the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, or other armed services, public health service including, but not limited to, 4 5 a federally qualified health center authorized and operating under Section 330 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 6 § 254B), provided, however, that such federally qualified 7 8 health centers shall register pursuant to Section 34-9-7.2 9 (provided further however, dentists, dental hygienists, and 10 other personnel employed by any public health service which 11 performs dental health care for the general public under programs funded in whole or part by the state or federal 12 13 government shall be subject to all of the provisions of this 14 chapter and the rules and regulations duly promulgated by the 15 Board of Dental Examiners board governing the practice of 16 dentistry and dental hygiene in this state), Coast Guard, or 17 Veteran's Administration.

18 "(3) The practice of dentistry by a licensed dentist 19 of other states or countries at meetings of the Alabama Dental 20 Association or components thereof, or other like dental 21 organizations approved by the board, while appearing as 22 clinicians, or when appearing in emergency cases upon the 23 specific call of dentists duly licensed under this chapter.

"(4) The filling of prescriptions of a licensed and
 registered dentist, as hereinafter provided, by any person or

persons, association, corporation, or other entity for the 1 2 construction, reproduction, or repair of prostheses (fixed or 3 removable) or appliances on a cast made by or from impressions made by a licensed and currently registered dentist, to be 4 5 used or worn as a substitute for natural teeth; provided, that the person or persons, association, corporation, or other 6 entity, shall not solicit or advertise, directly or 7 8 indirectly, by mail, card, newspaper, pamphlet, radio, 9 television, Internet, or otherwise, to the general public to 10 construct, reproduce, or repair prostheses (fixed or removable) or other appliances to be used or worn as 11 substitutes for natural teeth. 12

13 "(5) The use of roentgen machines or other means for 14 making radiographs, digital images, or similar records, of 15 dental or oral tissues under the supervision of a licensed 16 dentist or physician; provided, that the services shall not be 17 advertised by any name whatever as an aid or inducement to secure dental patronage, and no person shall advertise that he 18 19 or she has, leases, owns, or operates a roentgen or other 20 machine for the purpose of making dental radiographs or 21 images, of the human teeth or tissues or the oral cavity, or 22 administering treatments thereto for any disease thereof.

"(6) The giving of a general anesthetic by a nurseanesthetist who administers a general anesthetic under the

direct supervision of a duly licensed dentist to a patient who is undergoing dental treatment rendered by the dentist.

3 "(7) The use of a nurse in the practice of
4 professional or practical nursing, as defined in Sections
5 34-21-1 through 34-21-26, by a dentist.

6 "(8) A dentist who engages in the practice of 7 dentistry across state lines in an emergency, as defined by 8 the board.

9 "(9) A dentist who engages in the practice of 10 dentistry across state lines on an irregular or infrequent basis. The "irregular or infrequent" practice of dentistry 11 across state lines is considered to occur if the practice 12 13 occurs less than 10 times in a calendar year or involves fewer 14 than 10 patients in a calendar year, or the practice comprises 15 less than one percent of the diagnostic or therapeutic 16 practice of the dentist.

17 "(10) A dentist, or dental hygienist, or expanded duty dental assistant on active duty, or performing his or her 18 19 duties as a reservist in the military, is not subject to any 20 fee required for a special purpose license to practice 21 dentistry across state lines. The dentist, or dental 22 hygienist, or expanded duty dental assistant shall notify the 23 board in advance of his or her participation in military 24 activities and shall forward a copy of his or her current 25 dental license or permit, or both, to the board. The dentist,

1	or dental hygienist <u>, or expanded duty dental assistant</u> shall
2	also provide proof of military status and any orders requiring
3	him or her to perform dental treatment services in this state.
4	"§34-9-7.2.
5	"A 501(c)(3) entity, as defined under Section
6	501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, that operates a dental
7	clinic that provides dental services shall register with the
8	board. The information provided to the board as a part of the
9	registration process shall include the name of the
10	corporation, the nonprofit status of the corporation, sites
11	where dental services shall be provided by the corporation,
12	and the names of all persons employed by, or contracting with,
13	the corporation who are required to hold a license pursuant to
14	this chapter. A copy of the entity's 501(c)(3) certification
15	from the Internal Revenue Service shall be filed with the
16	board. If the entity has multiple clinics, the entity shall
17	register each clinic with the board and the entity shall have
18	one licensed dentist serving as chief of dental services for
19	all of the clinics. All dentists <u>,</u> and hygienists <u>, and expanded</u>
20	duty dental assistants at each clinic shall possess the
21	applicable licenses or permits required by this chapter and
22	shall be subject to this chapter.

23 "§34-9-8.

24 "(a) The board shall annually issue dental faculty25 teaching permits to persons who are bona fide members of the

faculty of a dental college, if they hold a dental degree but 1 2 are not licensed and registered to practice dentistry, or 3 dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting in the state. The dean of any dental college located in the state 4 5 shall annually certify to the board the bona fide members of the clinical faculty of the college who are not licensed and 6 7 registered to practice dentistry or dental hygiene in the 8 state. The board shall issue teaching permits to applicants 9 upon the certification by the dean. The teaching permits shall 10 be invalid if the holder ceases to be a member of the clinical 11 faculty of the dental college. The dean of any dental college shall promptly notify the board regarding changes in the 12 13 faculty which affect the eligibility of a faculty member to 14 possess a teaching permit. The holder of a teaching permit shall be subject to this chapter and may perform all clinical 15 16 operations which a person licensed to practice dentistry, or 17 dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting in the state 18 is entitled to perform. The operations may only be performed 19 within the facilities of the dental college or any other facility approved by the board as an adjunct to his or her 20 21 teaching functions in the college. An annual fee established 22 pursuant to this chapter shall be paid to the board when the 23 teaching permit is issued.

24 "(b) The board shall annually issue dental faculty25 special teaching permits to persons who are bona fide members

of the faculty of a dental college if they hold a dental 1 2 degree but are not licensed and registered to practice 3 dentistry, or dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting in the state. The dean of any dental college located 4 5 in the state shall annually certify to the board the bona fide members of the clinical faculty of the college who are not 6 7 licensed and registered to practice dentistry, or dental 8 hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting in the state. The 9 board shall issue special teaching permits to applicants upon 10 certification by the dean. The special teaching permits shall 11 be invalid if the holder ceases to be a member of the clinical faculty of the dental college. The dean of any dental college 12 13 shall promptly notify the board regarding changes in the 14 faculty which affect the eligibility of a faculty member to 15 possess a special teaching permit. The holder of a special 16 teaching permit shall be subject to this chapter and may 17 perform all clinical operations on his or her private patients 18 which a person licensed to practice dentistry or dental 19 hygiene in the state is entitled to perform. The clinical operations may only be performed within the faculty private 20 21 practice facilities of the dental college or any other 22 facility approved by the board. An annual fee established 23 pursuant to this chapter shall be paid to the board when the 24 special teaching permit is issued.

25 "\$34-9-9.

"(a) No person other than a dentist licensed 1 pursuant to this chapter or a 501(c)(3) entity registered 2 3 under Section 34-9-7.2 may do any of the following: "(1) Employ a dentist, dental hygienist, or both 4 5 expanded duty dental assistant in the operation of a dental office. 6 7 "(2) Place in the possession of a dentist, dental 8 hygienist, expanded duty dental assistant, or other agent such dental material or equipment as may be necessary for the 9 10 management of a dental office on the basis of a lease or any 11 other agreement for compensation for the use of such material, equipment, or offices. 12 13 "(3) Retain the ownership or control of dental 14 equipment, material, or office and make the same available in 15 any manner for the use of a dentist, dental hygienist, 16 expanded duty dental assistant, or other agent. 17 "(4) The term "person" as used in this section, 18 shall not in any way pertain to state, county, municipal, or 19 city institutions but shall be deemed to include any individual, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity 20 21 not licensed to practice dentistry in the State of Alabama. 22 "(5) Nothing in this subsection shall apply to bona 23 fide sales of dental equipment, material, or office secured by 24 a chattel mortgage or retention title agreement, or to an 25 agreement for the rental of the equipment or office by bona

fide lease at a reasonable amount, and under which agreement the licensee under this chapter maintains complete care, custody, and control of the equipment and the practice. Further, nothing in this subsection shall prohibit or restrict persons, firms, or corporations from employing or retaining licensed dentists to furnish dental treatment for their employees or dependents of their employees.

8 "(b) A prohibited business arrangement or 9 relationship as defined in subsection (a) shall not be 10 considered a violation of that subsection if a prohibited 11 arrangement or relationship results from the death of a 12 licensed dentist and is cured within 12 months of the date of 13 the death.

14 "(c) The purpose of this section is to prevent a 15 non-dentist from influencing or otherwise interfering with the 16 exercise of a dentist's independent professional judgment. In 17 addition to the acts specified in subsection (a), no person, 18 other than a dentist licensed in accordance with this chapter, 19 shall enter into a relationship with a person licensed under this chapter pursuant to which the unlicensed person exercises 20 control over the selection of a course of treatment for a 21 22 patient, the procedures or materials to be used as a part of 23 such course of treatment, or the manner in which such course 24 of treatment is carried out by the licensee.

1	"(d) No person other than a dentist licensed
2	pursuant to this chapter or a 501(c)(3) entity registered
3	under Section 34-9-7.2 shall exercise control over any of the
4	following:
5	"(1) The patient records of a dentist.
6	"(2) Policies and decisions relating to pricing,
7	credit, refunds, warranties, and advertising.
8	"(3) Decisions relating to office personnel and
9	hours of practice.
10	"(e) Any licensed <u>or permitted</u> dentist <u>,</u> or dental
11	hygienist, or expanded duty dental assistant who enters into
12	any of the arrangements or relationships in violation of
13	subsection (a) or subsection (c) with an unlicensed person as
14	defined above, may be subject to any of the penalties set
15	forth in Section 34-9-18.
16	"§34-9-10.
17	"(a) Every person who desires to practice dentistry
18	within the State of Alabama shall file an application
19	prescribed by the board. Notwithstanding the method of
20	obtaining licensure or any particular requirement set forth
21	herein, every person as a prerequisite to licensure must shall
22	be at least 19 years of age, of good moral character, a
23	citizen of the United States or, if not a citizen of the
24	United States, a person who is legally present in the United
25	States with appropriate documentation from the federal

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1 government, a graduate of a dental school or college 2 accredited by the American Dental Association Commission on 3 Dental Accreditation and approved by the board and <u>must shall</u> 4 satisfy any other requirement set forth in any rule adopted by 5 the board.

6 "(b) Licensure by examination shall be applicable to 7 the following categories:

8 "(1) Those individuals who have never been licensed 9 or taken an examination and whose application to take an 10 examination administered or approved by the board is received 11 by the board within 18 months of graduation from dental 12 school.

"(2) Those individuals who have successfully passed an examination approved but not administered by the board so long as an application for licensure is received by the board within five years of the date of notification of passing such examination. All applicants shall pay a fee which shall accompany the application.

"(c) Any individual who possesses a current license in any state, who has passed an examination approved by the board and who has, since graduation from dental or dental hygiene school, practiced or participated in a clinical residency or practiced dentistry or dental hygiene in the Armed Forces or with the public health service shall be eligible for licensure if an application is received by the

board within five years of the completion of the subject
 residency or Armed Forces or public health service commitment.
 All the above applicants shall pay a fee which shall accompany
 the application.

5 "(d) Licensure by credentials may be utilized to 6 evaluate the theoretical knowledge and clinical skill of a dentist, or dental hygienist, or expanded duty dental 7 8 assistant when an applicant for licensure by credentials holds 9 a dental, or dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting 10 license in another state. The board may promulgate rules and regulations relating to licensure by credentials in addition 11 12 to any requirements by law. An applicant for licensure by 13 credentials must meet shall satisfy all of the following:

14 "(1) The dentist, or dental hygienist, or expanded
15 <u>duty dental assistant shall</u> must have been engaged in the
16 active practice of clinical dentistry, or clinical dental
17 hygiene, or clinical expanded duty dental assisting or in
18 full-time dental, or dental hygiene, or clinical expanded duty
19 <u>dental assisting</u> education for the five years or 5,000 hours
20 immediately preceding his or her application.

"(2) The applicant must <u>shall</u> hold a current, valid,
 unrevoked, and unexpired license in a state having examination
 standards regarded by the Board of Dental Examiners of Alabama
 <u>board</u> as an equivalent to the Alabama standards.

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"(3) The board of examiners in the state of current practice <u>must shall</u> verify or endorse that the applicant's license is in good standing without any restrictions.

"(4) The dentist, or dental hygienist, or expanded 4 5 duty dental assistant shall must not be the subject of a pending disciplinary action in any state in which the 6 individual has been licensed which shall be verified by a 7 8 query to the National Practitioner Data Bank, the Health 9 Integrity Protection Data Bank, the American Association of 10 Dental Boards Clearing House for Disciplinary Information, or any other pertinent bank currently existing or which may exist 11 12 in the future.

13 "(5) The applicant must <u>shall</u> provide a written 14 statement agreeing to be interviewed at the request of the 15 board.

16 "(6) The individual must <u>shall</u> successfully pass a 17 written jurisprudence examination.

18 "(7) There must <u>shall</u> be certification from the 19 United States Drug Enforcement Administration and from the 20 state board of any state in which the applicant is or has been 21 licensed that the DEA registration is not the subject of any 22 pending disciplinary action or enforcement proceeding of any 23 kind.

24 "(8) The dentist applicant shall submit affidavits25 from two licensed dentists practicing in the same geographical

area where the applicant is then practicing or teaching 1 2 attesting to the moral character, standing, and ability of the 3 applicant. The dental hygiene applicant shall submit affidavits from two licensed dentists or two licensed dental 4 5 hygienists, or any combination of two thereof, practicing in the same geographical area where the applicant is then 6 7 practicing or teaching attesting to the moral character, 8 standing, and ability of the applicant. The expanded duty 9 dental assistant applicant shall submit affidavits from two 10 licensed dentists, two licensed dental hygienists, or two licensed expanded duty dental assistants, or any combination 11 of two thereof, practicing in the same geographical area where 12 13 the applicant is then practicing or teaching attesting to the moral character, standing, and ability of the applicant. 14

"(9) The applicant must shall provide the board with an official transcript with school seal from the school of dentistry, or school of dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting which issued the applicant's professional degree or execute a request and authorization allowing the board to obtain the transcript.

"(10) The applicant must <u>shall</u> be a graduate of a
dental, or dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting
school, college, or educational program approved by the board.

"(11) The applicant must <u>shall</u> not be the subject of
any pending or final action from any hospital revoking,

1	suspending, limiting, modifying, or interfering with any
2	clinical or staff privileges.
3	"(12) The applicant must shall not have been
4	convicted of a felony or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude
5	or of any law dealing with the administering or dispensing of
6	legend drugs, including controlled substances.
7	"(13) The board may consider or require other
8	criteria including, but not limited to, any of the following:
9	"a. Questioning under oath.
10	"b. Results of peer review reports from constituent
11	dental societies or federal dental services.
12	"c. Substance abuse testing or treatment.
13	"d. Background checks for criminal or fraudulent
14	activities.
15	"e. Participation in continuing education.
16	"f. A current certificate in cardiopulmonary
17	resuscitation.
18	"g. Recent case reports or oral defense of diagnosis
19	and treatment plans.
20	"h. Proof of no physical or psychological impairment
21	that would adversely affect the ability to practice dentistry
22	or dental hygiene with reasonable skill and safety.
23	"i. An agreement to initiate practice within the
24	State of Alabama within a period of one year.

"j. Proof of professional liability coverage and
 that coverage has not been refused, declined, cancelled,
 nonrenewed, or modified.

"k. Whether the applicant has been subject to any 4 5 final disciplinary action in any state in which the individual has been licensed which shall be verified by a query in the 6 National Practitioner Data Bank, the Health Integrity 7 8 Protection Data Bank, the American Association of Dental 9 Boards Clearing House for Disciplinary Information, any state 10 where the applicant has been licensed, or any other pertinent bank currently existing or which may exist in the future. 11

"1. Whether the applicant's DEA registration or any
state controlled substances permit has ever been revoked,
suspended, modified, restricted, or limited in any way.
Provided, however, that any discipline that results only from
a failure to timely renew a registration or permit shall not
prevent an applicant from being eligible for this method of
licensure.

19 "(14) If all criteria and requirements are satisfied 20 and the board determines, after notice and hearing, that the 21 individual committed fraud or in any way falsified any 22 information in the application process, the license may be 23 revoked by the board.

"(15) In addition to the requirements for applicants
seeking licensure by credentials, an applicant desiring to

1 2 practice a specialty only must meet shall satisfy the following requirements:

3 "a. The specialty must <u>shall</u> be one in a branch of
4 dentistry approved by the American Dental Association.

5 "b. The applicant must meet <u>shall satisfy</u> the 6 existing educational requirements and standards set forth by 7 the American Dental Association for that approved specialty.

8 "c. An applicant who chooses to announce or practice 9 a specialty <u>must shall</u> limit his or her practice exclusively 10 to the announced special area or areas of dental practice.

"d. If an applicant who is initially licensed by 11 credentials for a specialty practice decides to renounce his 12 13 or her specialty and practice general dentistry, and the 14 license originally issued did not require a general dental 15 license but rather a specialty license, or the applicant 16 originally passed only a specialty examination, the applicant 17 may not practice general dentistry until he or she 18 successfully passes the board's regular general dentistry 19 examination. However, if the applicant has passed a general dentistry examination or has a general dentistry license, was 20 21 practicing a specialty, and decides not to continue that 22 specialty and practice only general dentistry, the applicant 23 is eligible for licensure by credentials as a general dentist.

24 "(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection25 (a), the board shall issue a special purpose license to

1 practice dentistry across state lines to an applicant who has 2 met the following requirements:

"(1) The applicant holds a full and unrestricted
license to practice dentistry in any state of the United
States or in territories, other than the State of Alabama, in
which the individual is licensed.

"(2) The applicant has not had any disciplinary
action or other action taken against him or her by any state
or licensing jurisdiction. If there has been previous
disciplinary or other action taken against the applicant, the
board may issue a certificate of qualification if it finds
that the previous disciplinary or other action indicates that
the dentist is not a potential threat to the public.

14 "(3) The applicant submits an application for a 15 certificate of qualification for a special purpose license to 16 practice dentistry across state lines on a form provided by 17 the board, remits an application fee in an amount established 18 by the board, and pays a fee.

"(f) A special purpose license issued by the board to practice dentistry across state lines limits the licensee solely to the practice of dentistry across state lines. The special purpose license shall be valid for a period of up to three years, shall expire on a renewal date determined by the board, and may be renewed upon receipt of a renewal fee as established by the board. Failure to renew a license according

to the renewal schedule established by the board shall cause the special purpose license to be inactive. An applicant may reapply for a special purpose license to practice dentistry across state lines following placement of the license on inactive status. The applicant shall meet the qualifications of subsection (e) in order to be eligible for renewal of the license.

8 "(g) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, 9 the board shall only issue a special purpose license to 10 practice dentistry across state lines to an applicant whose principal practice location and license to practice are 11 12 located in a state or territory of the United States whose 13 laws permit or allow for the issuance of a special purpose 14 license to practice dentistry across state lines or similar 15 license to a dentist whose principal practice location and 16 license are located in another state. It is the stated intent 17 of this section that dentists who hold a full and current 18 license in the State of Alabama be afforded the opportunity to obtain, on a reciprocal basis, a license to practice dentistry 19 20 across state lines in any other state or territory of the 21 United States as a precondition to the issuance of a special 22 purpose license as authorized by this section to a dentist 23 licensed in the other state or territory. The board shall 24 determine which states or territories have reciprocal

1 licensure requirements meeting the qualifications of this
2 section.

3 "(h) Any individual who does not qualify for licensure pursuant to any of the above subsections but who has 4 5 passed an examination approved by the board and possesses a current license in another state is eligible to apply for 6 7 licensure upon payment of a fee. The board shall have 8 discretion whether to require an examination for any such 9 individual, including the time, place, type, and content of 10 any such examination.

"(i) A current license shall mean one in good standing authorizing the individual to practice in the state of issuance.

"§34-9-12.

15 "(a) Every person granted a license to practice 16 dentistry, or dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental 17 assisting in this state by the Board of Dental Examiners of 18 Alabama board, as herein provided, shall cause his or her 19 license certificate to be recorded in the office of the judge 20 of probate of the county in which he or she desires to 21 practice before beginning the practice of dentistry, or dental 22 hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting in the county. Any 23 person receiving a license from the board, whether or not 24 intending to immediately engage in the practice of dentistry, 25 or dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting in this

state, shall cause his or her license certificate to be recorded in the office of the judge of probate in one of the counties of this state within 60 days of the issuance of the license certificate.

5 "(b) Every person issued a special purpose license to practice dentistry across state lines shall be subject to 6 the jurisdiction of the board, and all rules and regulations 7 8 of the board, including all matters relating to discipline. It 9 shall be the affirmative duty of every special purpose 10 licensee to report to the board in writing within 15 days of the initiation of any disciplinary action against the licensee 11 to practice dentistry by any state or territory in which the 12 13 licensee is licensed. In addition, the licensee agrees, by 14 acceptance of the license, to produce any patient records or 15 materials as requested by the board or to appear before the 16 board or any of its committees following receipt of a written 17 notice issued by the board. The notice may be issued by the board. The failure of a special purpose licensee to report, 18 19 produce records, or appear as set forth above shall subject the licensee to the disciplinary penalties as set forth in 20 Section 34-9-5. 21

"(c) Every person issued a special purpose license
to practice dentistry across state lines shall comply with all
laws, rules, and regulations governing the maintenance of
patient records, including patient confidentially

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requirements, regardless of the state where the records of any 2 patient within this state are maintained.

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"§34-9-13.

"Every practitioner of dentistry, and dental 4 5 hygiene, and expanded duty dental assisting within the meaning of this chapter shall have in his or her possession a license 6 certificate and an annual registration certificate in the 7 office wherein he or she practices. 8

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"§34-9-14.

10 "Every licensed dentist, and dental hygienist, and expanded duty dental assistant upon changing his or her place 11 of practice, whether from one building, city, street address, 12 13 or county to another, shall within 30 days thereafter furnish 14 the secretary-treasurer of the board with the new address. The 15 secretary-treasurer shall acknowledge receipt of change of 16 address within 30 days.

17

"§34-9-15.

"(a) No person shall practice dentistry_L or dental 18 19 hygiene, or dental assisting in the State of Alabama unless 20 licensed or permitted by the board and registered annually as 21 required by this chapter. The secretary-treasurer of the board 22 shall issue to each licensee an initial registration form 23 which shall contain space for the insertion of name, address, 24 date, and number of license certificate, and other information 25 as the board shall deem necessary. The licensee shall sign and

verify the accuracy of the registration before a notary public 1 2 after which he or she shall forward the registration to the 3 secretary-treasurer of the board together with a fee. Each subsequent registration shall be made in electronic format or 4 5 by United States mail upon a form to be determined by the board. On or before October 1 of each year, every dentist, and 6 dental hygienist, and expanded duty dental assistant licensed 7 8 or permitted to practice dentistry, or dental hygiene, or 9 expanded duty dental assisting in the state shall transmit 10 either online or by United States mail to the secretary-treasurer of the board the completed form prescribed 11 12 by the board, together with a fee established by the board 13 pursuant to this chapter, and receive thereafter the current 14 annual registration certificate authorizing him or her to 15 continue the practice of dentistry, or dental hygiene, or 16 expanded duty dental assisting in the state for a period of 17 one year. Any license or permit previously granted under the authority of this chapter or any prior dental practice act 18 19 shall automatically be suspended if the holder thereof fails 20 to secure the annual registration certificate before January 21 1, each year. Any dentist, or dental hygienist, or expanded 22 duty dental assistant whose license or permit is automatically 23 suspended by reason of failure, neglect, or refusal to secure 24 the annual registration certificate shall be reinstated by the

board upon payment of the penalty fee plus all accrued annual

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registration fees up to a maximum of five years, accompanied 1 2 with the prescribed form for annual registration of the 3 license or permit. Upon failure of any licensee or permittee 4 to file application for the annual registration certificate 5 and pay the annual registration fee on or before November 30, each year, the board shall notify the licensee or permittee by 6 mail addressed to the last address of record that the 7 8 application and fee have not been received and that, unless 9 the application and fee are received on or before the first 10 day of January, the license or permit shall be automatically suspended. The board shall notify the licensee or permittee by 11 mail addressed to the last address of record of the effective 12 13 date of the automatic suspension and the provisions for 14 registration of the license or permit. The board shall waive the annual payment of fees herein provided for and issue a 15 16 current annual registration certificate to any licensee or 17 permittee who, because of age or physical disability, has retired from the practice of dentistry, or dental hygiene, or 18 19 expanded duty dental assisting or who is suffering a malady of 20 a lingering or permanent nature. The board by rule shall waive 21 annual registration and the payment of fees while any licensee 22 is on temporary active duty with any of the Armed Forces of 23 the United States. The waiver of fees herein provided shall be 24 effective so long as the retirement because of age or physical 25 disability or temporary active duty continues.

"(b) The board shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for the adoption of a program of continuing education for its licensees by October 1, 1991. After that date, the successful completion of continuing education program requirements shall be a requisite for renewal of licenses issued pursuant to this chapter.

11 "§34-9-18. 12 "(a) The board may invoke disciplinary action as outlined in subsection (b) hereof whenever it shall be 13 14 established to the satisfaction of the board, after hearing as 15 hereinafter provided, that any dentist, or dental hygienist, 16 or expanded duty dental assistant has been guilty of the 17 following: "(1) Fraud, deceit, or misrepresentation in 18 19 obtaining any license, license certificate, annual 20 registration certificate, money, or other thing of value. 21 "(2) Gross immorality. 22 "(3) Is a menace to the public health or to patients 23 or others by reason of a disease.

"(4) Is an habitual user of intoxicants or drugs
 rendering him or her unfit for the practice of dentistry, or
 dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting.

4 "(5) Has been convicted for violation of federal or
5 state narcotics or barbiturate laws.

6

"(6) Is guilty of negligence or gross negligence.

7 "a. For the purposes of this subdivision, negligence 8 is defined as the failure to do what a reasonably prudent 9 dentist or dental hygienist would have done under the same or 10 similar circumstances or the doing of that which a reasonably 11 prudent practitioner would not have done under the same or 12 similar circumstances.

13 "b. For the purposes of this subdivision, gross 14 negligence is defined as willful or wanton conduct with 15 reckless, malicious, or conscious disregard for the rights or 16 safety of others, or conduct that is so deliberate, 17 outrageous, and callous as to display total indifference to 18 the health or safety of a patient, that could result in 19 serious bodily injury or death.

"(7) Is guilty of employing, allowing, or permitting any unlicensed person or persons to perform any work in his or her office which, under this chapter, can only be legally done by a person or persons holding a license to practice dentistry, or dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting. "(8) Willfully or negligently violates the rules of
 the State Department of Health or of the board regarding
 sanitation.

"(9) Is guilty of division of fees, or agreeing to
split or divide the fee received for dental service with any
person for bringing or referring a patient without the
knowledge of the patient or his or her legal representative,
except the division of fees between dentists practicing in a
partnership and sharing professional fees, or in case of one
licensed dentist employing another.

"(10) Is guilty of professional connection or association with or lending his or her name to anyone who is engaged in the illegal practice of dentistry, or dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting.

"(11) Conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction of a felony or a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude.

18 "(12)a. A dental hygienist using or attempting to 19 use in any manner whatsoever any prophylactic list, call list, 20 records, reprints, or copies of same, or information gathered 21 therefrom, of the names of patients whom the dental hygienist 22 served in the office of a prior employer, unless the names 23 appear upon the bona fide call or prophylactic list of his or 24 her present employer and were caused to appear through the 25 legitimate practice of dentistry, or dental hygiene, or

1 <u>expanded duty dental assisting</u> as provided for in this
2 chapter.

"b. A licensed dentist who aids or abets or 3 encourages a dental hygienist or an expanded duty dental 4 5 assistant employed by him or her to make use of a prophylactic list or the calling by telephone or by the use of letters 6 transmitted through the mails to solicit patronage from 7 8 patients formerly served in the office of any dentist employing the hygienist, expanded duty dental assistant, or 9 10 nurse.

11 "c. An expanded duty dental assistant using or 12 aiding, abetting, or encouraging a dental hygienist to use in 13 any manner whatsoever any prophylactic list, call list, 14 records, reprints, or copies of same, or information gathered 15 therefrom, of the names of patients whom the expanded duty 16 dental assistant served in the office of a prior employer, 17 unless the names appear upon the bona fide call or prophvlactic list of his or her present employer and were 18 19 caused to appear through the legitimate practice of dentistry, dental hygiene, or expanded duty dental assisting as provided 20 21 for in this chapter.

"(13) Pertaining to licensed dentists only, the
prescribing, administering or dispensing of any controlled
substances enumerated in Schedules I through V contained in
the Alabama Uniform Controlled Substances Act, Chapter 2 of

1 Title 20, or any amendment or successor thereto, or any drug 2 not prescribed for any dentally or facially related condition, 3 and/or for any necessary medication during the course of 4 treatment rendered directly by the dentist, for any person not 5 under his or her treatment in the regular practice of his or 6 her profession.

"(14) Irregularities in billing an insurance company 7 8 or other third party payer for services rendered to a patient. 9 For the purposes of this section irregularities in billing 10 shall include: Reporting charges for the purpose of obtaining a total payment in excess of that usually received by the 11 dentist for the services rendered; falsely reporting treatment 12 13 dates for the purpose of obtaining payment; falsely reporting 14 charges for services not rendered; falsely reporting services 15 rendered for the purpose of obtaining payment; or failing to advise any third party payer that the copayment provisions of 16 17 a contract have been abrogated by accepting the payment received from the third party payer as full payment. 18

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"(15) Violating any rule adopted by the board.

"(16) Has had his or her license <u>or permit</u> to
practice dentistry, or dental hygiene, <u>or expanded duty dental</u>
assisting from another state suspended or revoked based upon
acts similar to those described in this section. A certified
copy of the record of suspension or revocation of the state

1	making the suspension or revocation shall be conclusive
2	evidence thereof.
3	"(17) Violating any provision of this chapter.
4	"(b) When the board finds any dentist, or dental
5	hygienist, or expanded duty dental assistant guilty of any of

8 "(d) No disciplinary action as outlined in 9 subsection (b) or (c) hereof shall be invoked or entered 10 except after hearing by the board as provided in this chapter, 11 and such order is subject to judicial review as provided by 12 this chapter.

"No order of suspension or revocation provided in this section shall be made or entered except after hearing by the board as provided in this chapter, and the order shall be subject to judicial review as provided by this chapter.

17 "(e) The board may temporarily suspend a special 18 purpose license to practice dentistry across state lines 19 without a hearing on either of the following grounds:

"(1) The failure of the licensee to appear orproduce records or materials as requested by the board.

"(2) The initiation of a disciplinary action against
the licensee by any state or territorial licensing
jurisdiction in which the licensee holds a license to practice
dentistry.

"Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 1 2 including the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act, the 3 temporary suspension provided herein shall remain in effect until either the licensee has complied with the request of the 4 5 board or the disciplinary action pending against the licensee has been terminated in favor of the licensee and the temporary 6 suspension has been terminated by a written order of the 7 8 board. A special purpose license to practice dentistry across 9 state lines is subject to each of the grounds for disciplinary 10 action provided in this section in accordance with the procedures of Section 34-9-24 and the Alabama Administrative 11 Procedure Act. 12

13 "(f) Members of the board, any agent, employee, 14 consultant, or attorney for the board, and the members of any 15 committee of dentists, or dental hygienists, or expanded duty 16 dental assistants impaneled by the board, shall be immune from 17 suits for any conduct in the course of their official duties with respect to investigations or hearings; provided, that the 18 19 persons act without malice and in good faith that such 20 investigations or hearings are warranted by the facts, known 21 to them after diligent effort to obtain the facts of the 22 matter relative to the investigations or hearings.

"(g) Nothing in this chapter shall be interpreted to limit or restrict the authority of the board to discipline any dentist licensed to practice in this state who violates this

chapter while engaging in the practice of dentistry within
 this or any other state.

3 "(h) The board shall have the authority to adopt 4 rules imposing a non-disciplinary administrative penalty for 5 designated violations of this chapter.

"Whoever sells or offers to sell a diploma 7 8 conferring a dental, or dental hygiene, or expanded duty 9 dental assistant degree, or a license certificate or annual 10 registration certificate granted pursuant to this chapter or 11 prior dental act, or procures such diploma or license 12 certificate or annual registration certificate with intent that it shall be used as evidence of the right to practice 13 14 dentistry or dental hygiene as defined by law, by a person 15 other than the one upon whom it was conferred or to whom such 16 license certificate or annual registration certificate was 17 granted, or with fraudulent intent alters such diploma or 18 license certificate or annual registration certificate, or uses or attempts to use it when it is so altered shall be 19 20 deemed quilty of a misdemeanor. The board may impose any of 21 the penalties outlined in Section 34-9-18 against any person 22 found guilty of making a false statement or cheating, or of 23 fraud or deception either in applying for a license, a license 24 certificate, or annual registration or in taking any of the 25 examinations provided for herein.

1 "§34-9-26.

2 "(a) No person shall practice as a dental hygienist 3 in this state until such person has passed an examination given by the board or approved by the board, or both, under 4 5 rules and regulations as the board may promulgate and the payment of a fee. The board shall issue licenses and license 6 certificates as dental hygienists to those persons who have 7 8 passed the examination and have been found qualified by the board. The license certificate and annual registration 9 10 certificate shall be displayed in the office in which the 11 dental hygienist is employed. No person shall be entitled to a 12 license and license certificate unless the person is 19 years 13 of age and of good moral character. Each applicant for 14 examination and license as a dental hygienist shall be a 15 graduate of a school of dental hygiene which has been approved 16 by the board, or in lieu thereof, shall have served as a 17 dental assistant for a period of time established by board 18 rule and shall have served at least one year as a dental 19 hygienist trainee under a training permit issued by the board 20 to a qualified dentist practicing in this state in accordance 21 with the dental hygienist training program established by the 22 Board of Dental Examiners of Alabama board. Any person 23 practicing in violation of this section shall be guilty of a 24 misdemeanor, and the board may impose the penalties outlined in Section 34-9-18 for such violation. 25

1	"(b) No person shall practice as an expanded duty
2	dental assistant in this state until such person has passed an
3	examination given by the board or approved by the board, or
4	both, under rules and regulations as the board may promulgate
5	and the payment of a fee. The board shall issue licenses and
6	license certificates as expanded duty dental assistants to
7	those persons who have passed the examination and have been
8	found qualified by the board. The license certificate and
9	annual registration certificate shall be displayed in the
10	office in which the expanded duty dental assistant is
11	employed. No person shall be entitled to a license and license
12	certificate unless the person is 19 years of age and of good
13	moral character. Each applicant for examination and license as
14	a expanded duty dental assistant shall be a graduate of a
15	school of expanded duty dental assisting which has been
16	approved by the board. Any person practicing in violation of
17	this section shall be quilty of a misdemeanor, and the board
18	may impose the penalties outlined in Section 34-9-18 for such
19	violation.
20	"§34-9-27.
21	"A dental hygienist Dental hygienists and expanded
22	duty dental assistants shall work only under the direct
23	supervision of a duly licensed dentist practicing in this
24	state. Dental hygienists and expanded duty dental assistants
25	may make, develop, and mount oral radiographs; remove

1 calcareous deposits, accretions, or stains from the teeth, perform any intra-oral procedures duties allowed by rule or 2 3 regulation of the Board of Dental Examiners of Alabama board and assist a licensed or permitted dentist in his or her 4 5 practice; however, expanded duty dental assistants may not perform any irreversible procedure, including surgery. Any 6 person dental hygienist licensed by the board under this 7 8 section who has completed the curriculum for dental hygienists 9 at a dental school approved by the board shall have the right 10 to use the title registered dental hygienist Registered Dental Hygienist or the abbreviation thereof, "R.D.H." appended to 11 his or her name signifying the license conferred. The board 12 13 may impose any of the penalties outlined in Section 34-9-18 14 against any dentist who shall permit any dental hygienist or 15 expanded duty dental assistant working under his or her 16 supervision to perform any operation other than those 17 permitted under the provisions of this section, and may impose 18 the penalties outlined in Section 34-9-18 against any dental 19 hygienist or expanded duty dental assistant who shall perform 20 any operation other than those permitted under this section. "\$34-9-28. 21

It shall be the duty of all licensed dental hygienists <u>and expanded duty dental assistants</u> to notify the board, in writing, of any change of address or employer and have issued to them an annual registration certificate by the

board. Any dental hygienist <u>or expanded duty dental assistant</u> whose license shall be automatically suspended by reason of failure, neglect, or refusal to secure the annual registration certificate may be reinstated by the board upon payment of the penalty fee plus the current year's registration fee. The form and method provided for in Section 34-9-15 shall apply to the annual registration of dental hygienists.

"§34-9-40.

9 "(a) In order to accomplish the purposes and to 10 provide for the enforcement of this chapter, there is hereby 11 created the Board of Dental Examiners of Alabama board . The board is hereby vested with the authority to carry out the 12 13 purposes and enforce the provisions of this chapter. On June 14 24, 1959, the members of the present board now in existence 15 shall hold office for the remainder of their respective terms 16 for which they have been elected and thereafter until their 17 successors are elected and qualified and shall constitute the 18 board under this chapter. The board shall consist of six 19 dentists who shall be selected in the method set forth herein 20 all of whom having been actively engaged in the practice of 21 dentistry in the State of Alabama for at least five years next 22 preceding the date of their election and one dental hygienist 23 elected at-large as provided in subsection (b). Each member of 24 the board shall be a citizen of this state. No member of the 25 board shall be a member of the faculty of any dental school,

dental college, dental hygiene school, or dental hygiene 1 2 college or receive any financial benefits for teaching in any 3 dental school, dental college, dental hygiene school, or dental hygiene college or have a financial interest in a 4 5 commercial dental laboratory or a dental supply business. One member, who is qualified as provided herein, shall be selected 6 by the Alabama Dental Society every five years. As for all 7 8 elections of members, any group of 10 or more licensed dentists, residing and practicing dentistry in the state, may 9 10 nominate a candidate for the position of board member by submitting a petition bearing their signatures to the 11 secretary of the board to be postmarked no later than the 12 13 first day of July in the year of the election. The board shall 14 cause the election ballots to be mailed or published digitally 15 not later than September 1 in the year of the election to all 16 the licensed dentists residing and practicing in the state and 17 currently registered as prescribed by law, along with the annual registration form for the forthcoming fiscal year. Both 18 19 the annual registration form and fee must shall accompany the 20 ballot that shall be postmarked, or otherwise submitted 21 electronically, no later than October 1 to the secretary of 22 the board no later than the first board workday following 23 October 1 each year, ballots being nullified unless 24 accompanied by or electronically filed with completed annual 25 registration form and annual registration fee. Three members

of the board shall be present at the time the ballots, digital 1 or physical, are tallied. Any candidate receiving a majority 2 3 of the votes shall be declared elected to the board and will take the oath of office on or before October 15 in the year of 4 5 his or her election. In the event no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast, the board shall conduct a run-off 6 election between the two candidates receiving the largest 7 8 number of votes. The board shall cause the ballots pertaining 9 to the run-off election to be mailed or digitally published on 10 or before October 31 of the election year to all the licensed dentists who have renewed their licenses for the succeeding 11 year as of October 1 of the current year, are residing and 12 13 practicing in the state, and currently are registered as 14 prescribed by law, and the ballots pertaining to the run-off 15 election shall be postmarked or digitally published no later 16 than the fourteenth day of November in the year of the run-off election and received, if mailed, by the secretary of the 17 board no later than the first board workday following the 18 19 fourteenth day of November. All mailed ballots received after this date shall be nullified. In the event of a run-off 20 21 election, the candidate receiving the largest number of votes 22 in the run-off election shall be declared elected to the board 23 and shall take the oath of office and begin his or her term of 24 office no later than the next scheduled board meeting. Every 25 member elected shall hold office for a period of five years,

which terms shall begin immediately upon taking an oath to 1 2 properly and faithfully discharge the duties of his or her 3 office and until his or her successor is elected and qualified, and the member so elected shall not at the 4 5 expiration of the term be eligible to succeed himself or herself. The membership of the board shall be inclusive and 6 7 reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and 8 economic diversity of the state. Except for the board member 9 position selected by the Alabama Dental Society, vacancies on 10 the board shall be filled by the board by the appointment of the immediate past member of the board, and if for any reason 11 the immediate past member of the board is unable to accept the 12 13 appointment, then the board shall fill the vacancy by 14 appointment of the most recent past board member who is 15 willing to accept the appointment. If no past board member 16 accepts the appointment, then the board may, by majority vote, 17 appoint any licensed dentist qualified under the provisions of 18 this chapter. In the event of a vacancy in the position 19 selected by the Alabama Dental Society, the Alabama Dental Society shall select a dentist who is qualified as provided 20 21 herein to fill the vacancy. Members of the board shall be 22 removed by a two-thirds vote of the registered dentists in the 23 state for neglect of duty or any just cause, by petition to the secretary of the board by 10 percent of the licensed 24 25 dentists in the state. On or before July 1, 1962, the board

1 shall send a copy of this section to all licensed dentists in 2 the state.

3 "(b)(1) One member of the board shall be a licensed dental hygienist. The dental hygienist member shall be of good 4 5 moral and ethical character and shall have been actively engaged in the practice of dental hygiene in the State of 6 7 Alabama for at least five years preceding the date of 8 election. No dental hygienist member shall be a member of the 9 faculty of any dental school, dental college, dental hygiene 10 school, or dental hygiene college or receive any financial 11 benefits for teaching in any dental school, dental college, 12 dental hygiene school, or dental hygiene college or have a 13 financial interest in a commercial dental laboratory or dental 14 supply business while serving on the board.

15 "(2) The dental hygienist member shall be elected as 16 follows:

17 "a. Any group of 10 or more licensed dental 18 hygienists, residing and practicing dental hygiene in the 19 State of Alabama, may nominate a candidate for the dental hygienist position by submitting a petition bearing their 20 21 signatures to the secretary of the board no later than the 22 first day of July in the year of an election. The board shall 23 cause election ballots to be mailed or published digitally no 24 later than September 1 in the year of an election to all the 25 licensed dental hygienists residing and practicing in the

state and currently registered as prescribed by law. Both the 1 2 annual registration form and the registration fee must shall 3 accompany the ballot that shall be postmarked or otherwise submitted electronically no later than October 1 to the 4 5 secretary of the board no later than the first board workday following October 1 each year, and the ballots will be 6 7 nullified unless accompanied by or electronically filed with a 8 completed annual registration form and the annual registration 9 fee.

10 "b. Three members of the board shall be present at the time the ballots, digital or physical, are tallied. Any 11 candidate receiving a majority of the votes shall be declared 12 13 elected to the board and shall take the oath of office on or 14 before October 15 in the year of his or her election. In the 15 event no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast, the 16 board shall conduct a run-off election between the two 17 candidates receiving the largest number of votes. The board shall cause the ballots pertaining to any run-off election to 18 19 be mailed or digitally published on or before October 31 of 20 the election year to all licensed dental hygienists who have 21 renewed their licenses for the succeeding year as of October 1 22 of the current year, are residing and practicing in the state, 23 and are currently registered as prescribed by law, and the 24 ballots pertaining to the run-off election shall be postmarked 25 or digitally submitted no later than the fourteenth day of

November in the year of the run-off election and received, if 1 2 mailed, by the secretary of the board no later than the first 3 board workday following November 14. All mailed ballots received after November 14 shall be nullified. In the event of 4 5 a run-off election, the dental hygienist candidate receiving the largest number of votes in the run-off election shall be 6 declared elected to the board and shall take the oath of 7 8 office and begin his or her term of office no later than the 9 next scheduled board meeting.

10 "c. All elections as described above shall be11 conducted by the board.

12 "(3) The dental hygienist member shall be removed by 13 a two-thirds vote of the registered dental hygienists in the 14 state for neglect of duty or any just cause by petition to the 15 secretary of the board by 10 percent of the licensed dental 16 hygienists in the state.

17 "(4) The dental hygienist member shall hold that position for a period of five years, which term shall begin 18 19 immediately upon taking an oath to properly and faithfully discharge the duties of his or her office and continue until 20 21 his or her successor is elected and qualified, and the member 22 so elected shall not at the expiration of the term be eligible 23 to succeed himself or herself. If a vacancy occurs in the 24 position of dental hygienist, the unexpired term shall be filled by the board by the appointment of the immediate past 25

dental hygienist member. If for any reason the immediate past 1 2 dental hygienist member is unable to accept the appointment, 3 then the board shall fill the vacancy by a majority vote of the other board members by the appointment of some other past 4 5 dental hygienist member. If a vacancy occurs and there is not an immediate past dental hygienist member or other past dental 6 7 hygienist member, the vacancy shall be filled by a unanimous 8 vote of the board by the appointment of some otherwise 9 qualified dental hygienist.

10 "(5) The dental hygienist member shall advise the 11 board on matters relating to dental hygiene and shall only be permitted to vote on matters relating to dental hygiene. The 12 13 board shall provide the dental hygienist member with timely 14 notice of all board meetings and the dental hygienist member shall be allowed to attend all meetings unless prohibited by 15 16 law from attendance at any disciplinary hearings. The board 17 shall not adopt any rule relating to the practice of dental 18 hygiene unless the proposed rule has been submitted to the 19 dental hygienist member for review and comment at least 30 20 days prior to its adoption. The dental hygienist member shall 21 be entitled to the same compensation and expenses paid to 22 dentist members of the board pursuant to Section 34-9-41.

"(c) Any dentist or dental hygienist who has been
found guilty of violating this chapter or any provision of a
dental practice act of any other state and as a result his or

her license was revoked, suspended, or placed on probation or who has been convicted of a felony, shall not be eligible for election or membership on the board for a period of five years from the termination of any such revocation, suspension, or probation.

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"§34-9-46.

"In all matters pending before it, the board shall 7 8 have the power to issue subpoenas and compel the attendance of 9 witnesses and the production of all necessary papers, books, 10 and records, documentary evidence and materials or other evidence. Any person failing or refusing to appear or testify 11 regarding any matter about which he or she may be lawfully 12 13 questioned or to produce any papers, books, records, 14 documentary evidence, or materials or other evidence in the 15 matter to be heard, after having been required by order of the 16 board or by a subpoena of the board to do so, may, upon 17 application by the board to any circuit judge of the State of 18 Alabama, be ordered to comply therewith; and, upon failure to 19 comply with the order of the circuit judge, the court may 20 compel obedience by attachment as for contempt as in case of 21 disobedience of a similar order or subpoena issued by the 22 court. The president and secretary-treasurer of the board 23 shall have authority to issue subpoenas, in a writing filed 24 with the board, may designate and authorize any member of the 25 board to issue subpoenas, and any board member shall have

authority to administer oaths to witnesses, or to take their 1 2 affirmation. A subpoena or other process of paper may be 3 served upon any person named therein, anywhere within the State of Alabama with the same fees and mileage by any officer 4 authorized to serve subpoenas or such other process or paper 5 in civil actions, in the same manner as is prescribed by law 6 for subpoenas issued out of the circuit courts of this state, 7 8 the fees and mileage and other costs to be paid as the board directs. 9

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"§34-9-47.

11 "Depositions may be taken within or without the State of Alabama in the manner provided for by the laws of 12 13 Alabama and the Alabama Rules of Civil Procedure for the 14 taking of depositions in matters pending in the circuit courts 15 of this state. The depositions shall be returnable to the 16 clerk of the circuit court of the county wherein the hearing 17 before the board is pending, and the clerk shall deliver the 18 depositions to the board upon request board office, and the 19 depositions may be opened or used by the parties to the 20 proceedings the same as is provided for in matters pending 21 before the circuit courts. The circuit court shall, upon 22 request of any interested party in any proceedings before the 23 state board, issue commissions for the taking of depositions 24 in the same manner as is provided for the issuance of

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commissions for the taking of depositions in matters pending before the circuit courts of this state.

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"§34-38-2.

"It shall be the duty and obligation of the State 4 5 Board of Dental Examiners and the State Board of Pharmacy to promote the early identification, intervention, treatment, and 6 rehabilitation of individuals within the respective 7 8 jurisdiction, licensed to practice in the State of Alabama, 9 who may be impaired by reason of illness, inebriation, 10 excessive use of drugs, narcotics, controlled substances, alcohol, chemicals, or other dependent forming substances, or 11 as a result of any physical or mental condition rendering such 12 13 person unable to meet the standards of his or her profession. 14 For the purposes of this chapter, the term "impaired" shall mean the inability of a dentist, hygienist, expanded duty 15 dental assistant, or pharmacist to practice with reasonable 16 17 skill and safety to patients by reason of illness, inebriation, excessive use of drugs, narcotics, controlled 18 19 substances, alcohol, chemicals, or other dependent forming substances, or as a result of any physical or mental condition 20 21 rendering such person unable to meet the standards of his or 22 her profession. In order to carry out this obligation, each board, individually or jointly, is hereby empowered to 23 24 contract with any nonprofit corporation, health provider, or 25 professional association for the purpose of creating,

supporting, and maintaining a committee of professionals to be 1 2 designated the Alabama Impaired Professionals' Committee. The 3 committee shall consist of not less than three nor more than 15 professionals licensed to practice dentistry or pharmacy in 4 5 the State of Alabama, and selected in a manner prescribed by the board or boards. The authority of the Alabama Impaired 6 Professionals' Committee shall not supersede the authority of 7 8 the board or boards to take disciplinary action against 9 individuals subject to this chapter. Nothing in this chapter 10 shall limit the power and authority of the board or boards to discipline an impaired individual subject to its jurisdiction; 11 provided that where an individual is impaired and currently in 12 13 need of intervention, treatment, or rehabilitation and such 14 individual is currently participating in programs or 15 rehabilitation recommended by the committee, then in its 16 discretion, the board or boards may refrain from taking or 17 continuing disciplinary action against such individual; and 18 further provided that where the board or boards, upon 19 reasonable cause to believe an individual subject to its 20 jurisdiction is impaired, has referred such individual to the 21 committee for evaluation, then in its discretion, the board or 22 boards may refrain from taking or continuing disciplinary 23 action against such individual. The board, or boards, is 24 authorized to may collect or expend such funds as are 25 available to it as deemed necessary to adequately provide for

the operational expenses of the Alabama Impaired 1 Professionals' Committee, including, but not limited to, the 2 3 actual cost of travel, office overhead and personnel expense, and compensation for the members of the committee and its 4 5 staff; provided that operational expenses of the Alabama Impaired Professionals' Committee shall not include the cost 6 7 of treatment or rehabilitation programs recommended by the 8 committee to individuals subject to this chapter. The funds provided by the board or boards, under this section for the 9 10 purposes stated herein shall not be subject to any provision 11 of law requiring competitive bidding."

12 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 13 first day of the third month following its passage and 14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
