9	only vote by absentee ballot if the elector meets							
10	certain criteria indicating that the elector is							
11	unavailable to vote in person on election day.

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19	Relating to absentee voting; to amend Sections							
20	17-11-3, 17-11-5, and 17-11-7, Code of Alabama 1975, to allow							
21	any qualified elector to vote by absentee ballot in an							
22	election.							
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:							
24	Section 1. Sections 17-11-3, 17-11-5, and 17-11-7,							
25	Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:							
26	"§17-11-3.							

"(a) Any qualified elector of this state may apply 1 2 for and vote an absentee ballot by mail or by hand delivery, as provided in Sections 17-11-5 and 17-11-9, in any primary, 3 4 general, special, or municipal election, if he or she makes application in writing therefor not less than five days prior 5 to the election in which he or she desires to vote and meets 6 7 one of the following requirements:. "(1) The person will be out of the county or the 8 9 state, or the municipality for municipal elections, on 10 election day.

11 "(2) The person has any physical illness or 12 infirmity which prevents his or her attendance at the polls, 13 whether he or she is within or without the county on the day 14 of the election.

15 "(3) The person works on a shift which has at least
16 10 hours which coincide with the hours the polls are open at
17 his or her regular polling place.

18 "(4) The person is enrolled as a student at an 19 educational institution located outside the county of his or 20 her personal residence attendance at which prevents his or her 21 attendance at the polls.

"(5) The person is a member of, or spouse or
dependent of a member of, the Armed Forces of the United
States or is similarly qualified to vote absentee pursuant to
the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting
Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973ff.

"(6) The person has been appointed as an election
 officer or named as a poll watcher at a polling place other
 than his or her regular polling place.

4 "(b) An applicant for an absentee ballot who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States, including the 5 6 Alabama National Guard, the United States Naval Reserves, the 7 United States Air Force Reserves, and the United States Army Reserve on active duty or active duty for training or an 8 applicant who is the spouse of any member of the armed forces 9 10 or any other applicant qualified to vote absentee pursuant to the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting 11 12 Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973ff, may make application for an absentee 13 ballot by filling out the federal postcard application form, authorized and provided for under the provisions of "The 14 15 Federal Voting Assistance Act of 1955," Public Law 296, Chapter 656, H.R. 4048, approved August 9, 1955, 84th Congress 16 17 1st Session.

"(c) Any registered elector who requires emergency 18 treatment of a licensed physician within five days of an 19 20 election may apply for an emergency absentee ballot for the 21 election and may vote by returning the absentee ballot no 22 later than noon on the day the election is held. The attendant 23 physician shall describe and certify the circumstances as 24 constituting an emergency on a special form designed by the Secretary of State and provided by his or her office to local 25 absentee election managers. The special form shall be attached 26 27 to the application.

1 "(d) Any registered elector whose name appears on 2 the poll list of qualified voters may vote by an emergency absentee ballot if he or she is required by his or her 3 4 employer under unforeseen circumstances to be out of the county on an emergency business trip on election day. Under 5 6 such circumstances, the applicant shall apply for an emergency 7 absentee ballot at the office of the absentee election manager no later than the close of the business day one day prior to 8 the election. The applicant shall complete and file an 9 10 application form designed by the Secretary of State for emergency absentee voters. The form shall contain an affidavit 11 12 which the applicant shall sign or swear acknowledging that he 13 or she was not aware of the out-of-county business requirement 14 prior to five days before the election. An applicant who meets the requirements of this subsection may vote by an emergency 15 absentee ballot. After voting the ballot, the voter shall hand 16 17 the ballot to the absentee election manager.

"(e) Notwithstanding any other provision of 18 otherwise applicable law, in the event more than one absentee 19 ballot is cast in the name of the single voter, whether any 20 21 such multiple ballot is cast by mail or otherwise, none of the 22 affidavit envelopes containing the multiple ballots shall be 23 opened, and none of the multiple ballots shall be counted, 24 except in the event of an election contest, upon the order of 25 the election contest tribunal. Upon the conclusion of an 26 election contest or, in the event no such contest is filed, 27 upon the expiration of time for filing such a contest, the

- 1 multiple ballots shall be provided to the district attorney, 2 with photocopies provided to the state Attorney General, for 3 such investigation, prosecution, or other action as may be 4 appropriate under applicable law.
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"§17-11-5.

6 "(a) Upon receipt of an application for an absentee 7 ballot as provided in Section 17-11-3, if the applicant's name appears on the list of qualified voters produced from the 8 state voter registration list in the election to be held, or 9 10 if the voter makes an affidavit for a challenged vote or provisional ballot, the absentee election manager shall 11 12 furnish the absentee ballot to the applicant by: (1) 13 Forwarding it by United States mail to the applicant's or 14 voter's residence address, or upon written request of the voter, to the address where the voter regularly receives mail 15 16 or (2) by handing the absentee ballot to the voter in person 17 or, in the case of emergency voting, his or her designee in person. If the absentee election manager has reasonable cause 18 to believe that the applicant has given a fraudulent address 19 on the application for the absentee ballot, the absentee 20 21 election manager shall turn over the ballot application to the 22 district attorney for any action which may be necessary under 23 this chapter. The absentee election manager may require 24 additional proof of a voter's eligibility to vote absentee 25 when there is evidence of continuous absentee voting. The 26 absentee election manager shall mail any absentee ballot 27 requested to be mailed as provided in Section 17-11-3 no later

than the next business day after an application has been received unless the absentee ballots have not been delivered to the absentee election manager. If the absentee ballots have not been so delivered, the absentee election manager shall hold all requests until the ballots are delivered and shall then respond by placing ballots in the mail no later than the next business day.

"(b) The official list of qualified voters shall be 8 9 furnished to the absentee election manager by the judge of 10 probate using a printout from the state voter registration 11 list of registered voters for that county containing vote 12 registration information useful in the identification of 13 absentee voters. The information provided in this report shall 14 be established by rules adopted by the Secretary of State with 15 the advice of the Alabama Circuit Court Clerks Association or its members and shall indicate whether the individual is 16 17 obligated to produce identification in accordance with Sections 17-9-30 and 17-10-1. The Secretary of State may 18 further provide by administrative rule for electronic access 19 20 to this list for optional use by the absentee election 21 manager. This list shall be made available beginning at least 22 45 days before the election. In municipal elections, the 23 official list of qualified voters shall be furnished to the 24 absentee election manager at least 35 days before the 25 election. Any supplemental list of qualified electors shall 26 also be provided to the absentee election manager as soon as 27 the list becomes available. The absentee election manager

shall underscore on the list the name of each voter who has applied for an absentee ballot and shall write immediately beside his or her name the word "absentee." The Secretary of State by rule may provide for electronic access to the absentee election manager's county list of registered voters and for the method of identifying applicants for absentee ballots in conjunction with the state voter registration list.

"(c) The absentee election manager shall enroll the 8 9 name, residence, and voting place of the applicant, and the date the application was received on a list of absentee 10 voters. Each day the absentee election manager shall enter on 11 12 the list the names, addresses, and voting places of each voter 13 who has that day applied for an absentee ballot and shall, for 14 all elections other than municipal elections, post a copy of the list of applications received each day on the regular 15 bulletin board or other public place in the county courthouse. 16 17 In municipal elections, the absentee election manager shall post a copy of the list of applications received each day on 18 the regular bulletin board or other public place in the city 19 hall. The absentee election manager in all elections shall 20 21 deliver to the board of registrars the day following the 22 election, a copy of the list of all absentee voters. The list 23 shall be maintained in the office of the circuit clerk for 60 24 days after the election, at which time it shall be delivered 25 to the judge of probate. Before the polls open at any election on election day, the absentee election manager shall 26 effectuate the delivery to the election officers of each 27

1 voting place a list showing the name and address of every 2 person whose name appears on the official list of qualified electors for the voting place who applied for an absentee 3 4 ballot in the election. The name of the person who applied for an absentee ballot shall be identified as an absentee voter on 5 6 the list of qualified electors kept at the voting place, and 7 the person shall not vote again, except that in county, state, and federal elections the person may vote a provisional 8 9 ballot. Applications for absentee ballots are required for 10 elections which are more than 30 days apart, except as to individuals voting pursuant to the federal Uniformed and 11 12 Overseas Absentee Voting Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973ff.

13 "(d) For individuals voting pursuant to the federal 14 Uniformed and Overseas Absentee Voting Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973ff, the Secretary of State shall by rule prescribe use of 15 16 standardized military and overseas voter registration 17 applications and applications for absentee ballots adopted by the United States government for such use. The Secretary of 18 State shall also prescribe by rule provisions within the 19 20 standard state application form for absentee voting which 21 permit the voter to identify himself or herself as a military 22 or overseas voter. Unless otherwise indicated by the military 23 or overseas voter, an application for an absentee ballot by 24 such a voter shall remain valid through the next two regularly 25 scheduled general election cycles for federal office. The 26 circuit clerk shall confirm by January 1 of each election year 27 the address of the military and overseas voters prior to

1 mailing the ballots during each election cycle, and the 2 absentee election manager shall provide an absentee ballot to the military and overseas voters for each such subsequent 3 4 election. The absentee election manager, within seven days 5 after each regularly scheduled general election for federal 6 office, shall report the number of military and overseas 7 ballots mailed out and the number of ballots received to the Secretary of State who shall report this information to the 8 9 Federal Election Assistance Commission within 90 days of each regularly scheduled general election for federal office. 10 "§17-11-7. 11 12 "(a) Each absentee ballot shall be accompanied by an 13 envelope upon which shall be printed an affidavit. 14 "(b) With respect to an absentee ballot cast 15 pursuant to Section 17-11-3, the affidavit shall read as 16 follows: 17 ""State of Alabama "County of 18 "I, the undersigned, do swear (or affirm) that: 19 "(1) I am a resident of \_\_\_\_\_ County in the 20 State of Alabama. 21 "(2) My place of residence in Alabama is: 22 23 (street) 24 Alabama 25 (city or town) (zip code)

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"\_\_\_\_ I have been appointed as an election officer at a polling place which is not my regular polling place.

5 "I further swear (or affirm) that I have not voted 6 nor will I vote in person in the election to which this ballot 7 pertains.

8 "I have marked the enclosed absentee ballot 9 voluntarily and I have read or had read to me and understand 10 the instructions accompanying this ballot and I have carefully 11 complied with such instructions.

"Moreover, I further swear (or affirm) that all of the information given above is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and that I understand that by knowingly giving false information so as to vote illegally by absentee ballot that I shall be guilty of a misdemeanor which is punishable by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or confinement in the county jail for not more than six months, or both.
