7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. (a) For the purpose of this act, the term 9 "Church" shall mean an indefinite number of persons who have 10 made a public confession of religion and who are associated 11 together by a covenant of church fellowship for the purpose of 12 worshiping and watching over the spiritual welfare of each 13 other.

14 (b) All church-owned buildings which have an area 15 greater than 12,000 square feet are exempt from Section 903 of the International Fire Code 903 and the National Fire 16 17 Protection Association Code 909 after the declaration of a disaster by the state or federal government if the church is 18 hosting or housing volunteers within the building who are 19 responding to the disaster if all the volunteers are 18 years 20 21 of age or over. The exemption shall be for the duration of the 22 disaster, however, it shall be no longer than three years.

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 24 first day of the third month following its passage and 25 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
