18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. This act shall be known and cited as the
20	Amiyah White Act.
21	Section 2. (a) For the purposes of this act, the
22	term motor vehicle shall mean any motor vehicle as defined in
23	Section 32-1-1.1, Code of Alabama 1975, and the term

incapacitated person shall mean any incapacitated person as

defined in Section 26-2A-20, Code of Alabama 1975.

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1	(b)(1) A licensed day care center, a licensed child
2	care facility, a program providing day care service to
3	incapacitated persons, or any other child care service that is
4	exempt from licensing pursuant to Section 38-7-3, Code of
5	Alabama 1975, or an employee thereof, or a person for hire
6	responsible for a child under the age of 7 or an incapacitated
7	person, shall not leave a child or an incapacitated person in
8	a motor vehicle unattended in a manner that creates an
9	unreasonable risk of injury or harm.

(2) A person violating this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than two thousand dollars (\$2,000). If a person has a prior conviction or adjudication under this section, the offense is a Class C misdemeanor.

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- (3) For purposes of determining prior conviction or adjudication pursuant to subdivision (2), conviction in municipal court shall be included.
- (4) If the child or incapacitated person receives physical injury as a result of a violation of this section, the person violating this section is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
- (5) If the child or incapacitated person receives serious physical injury as a result of a violation of this section, the person violating this section is guilty of a Class C felony.

1	(6) If the child or incapacitated person is fatally
2	injured as a result of a violation of this section, the person
3	violating this section is guilty of a Class B felony.

Section 3. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing in this act shall limit any existing cause of action or right to bring a cause of action. A violation of this act shall not be considered evidence of contributory negligence and the liability of an insurer shall not be limited or mitigated.

Section 4. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
