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8 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, a person is not permitted to collect protected wild animals or birds or bird eggs for scientific purposes unless the person has a permit from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. The cost of the permit is \$1 and a person who violates this provision is subject to a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$25.

This bill would establish three types of permits for the purposes of protection of wild invertebrate or vertebrate species, or their eggs, would increase the fees, and would provide that the applicable fine would be three times the cost of the appropriate permit.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from

1 becoming effective with regard to a local 2 governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of 3 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 6 7 the entity for the purpose.

> The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

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To amend Section 9-11-231 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to permits issued by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for the collection of protected wild animals or birds or bird eggs for propagation or scientific purposes; to provide that the law will apply to any wild invertebrate or vertebrate species, or their eggs; to provide for different types of permits and the fees for the permits; to further provide for the fines for violations; and

8	Section 1. Section 9-11-231 of the Code of Alabama

12	protected wild animal or bird or egg of any bird <u>invertebrate</u>
13	or vertebrate species, or their eggs, in this state for
14	propagation or scientific purposes except under the direction,
15	$\operatorname{supervision}_{\boldsymbol{L}}$ and $\operatorname{regulation}$ of the Commissioner of
16	Conservation and Natural Resources, who, on the payment of
17	\$1.00 the applicable fee, may issue such propagation or
18	scientific permits annually to properly accredited persons or
19	institutions . , as follows:
20	"(1) A general permit for individuals\$50.
21	"(2) An educational permit for professors or
22	teachers, which shall also allow their current students to

24	"(3) A master collecting permit involving more than
25	one individual acting in the name of a public or private firm,
26	corporation, agency, organization, or other entity\$100.

"(b) Any person, firm, association or corporation being or having in possession at any time such animal or bird or the eggs of such bird a protected wild invertebrate or vertebrate species, or their eggs, without a permit as provided required in this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction therefor, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$25.00 for each offense three times the amount of the applicable permit."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
