2 3 4 5 6 7 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the proceeds of the 8 four-cent excise tax on gasoline and lubricating 9 10 oil are used by the Department of Transportation 11 for the construction and maintenance of public 12 roads and bridges on the state highway system; by 13 counties for the resurfacing, restoration, and rehabilitation of paved county roads and bridges or 14 15 bridge replacement on the county road system; and 16 by municipalities for the resurfacing, restoration, 17 and rehabilitation of roads, bridges, and streets 18 within the municipality. 19 This bill would allow the proceeds of the 20 four-cent excise tax on gasoline and lubricating oil distributed to counties to be used for 21 22 vegetation management on the rights-of-way of 23 county roads. 24 25 A BTTT 26 TO BE ENTITLED 27 AN ACT

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To amend Section 40-17-224, Code of Alabama 1975, to allow the proceeds of the four-cent excise tax on gasoline and lubricating oil distributed to counties to be used for vegetation management on the rights-of-way of county roads. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 40-17-224, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

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"§40-17-224.

"(a) Within the meaning of this section, the
following words and phrases shall have the following meaning:

12 "(1) RESURFACING, RESTORATION, AND REHABILITATION 13 (RRR). Work undertaken primarily to preserve an existing 14 facility. Restoration and rehabilitation is considered to be 15 work required to return the existing pavement or bridge deck (including shoulders) to a condition of adequate structural 16 17 support or to a condition adequate for placement of an additional state of construction (bridge deck protective 18 system or resurfacing). Resurfacing consists of the placement 19 20 of additional surface material over the existing, restored, or 21 rehabilitated roadway or bridge deck to improve serviceability 22 or to provide additional strength. RRR work may include 23 changes to geometric features, such as minor widening, 24 flattening curves, or improving sight distances.

"(2) BRIDGE REPLACEMENT. Bridge replacement includes
 the replacement of existing bridge structures, and if
 necessary, the realignment of the adjacent approaches.

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1 "(3) VEGETATION MANAGEMENT. Action taken to maintain 2 the right-of-way of a road in a condition that is beneficial 3 to public safety and the longevity of the road infrastructure 4 including, but not limited to, restoration and maintenance of 5 the full width of the right-of-way through the use of 6 herbicides, bush hogging, and tree and limb removal.

7 "(b) It is the intent of the Legislature that the 8 proceeds of the tax collected on motor fuel, gasoline, and 9 lubricating oil under the provisions of this article shall be 10 used in the following manner:

"(1) Where the use is by the Department of Transportation, such use shall, with the approval of the Governor, be for the construction and maintenance of public roads and bridges on the state highway system.

15 "(2) Where the use is by a county, such use shall be for vegetation management or the resurfacing, restoration, and 16 17 rehabilitation of the paved county roads and bridges or bridge replacement on the county road system. Such funds shall not be 18 used for new construction unless 90 percent of the county's 19 paved road system has achieved a grade of 85 percent based on 20 21 the State of Alabama Department of Transportation's annual 22 maintenance report of county roads and bridges. These funds 23 shall not be used for the purchase of equipment. The net tax 24 proceeds distributed to the county shall not be commingled with other funds of the county, including any other gasoline 25 26 tax revenues, and shall be kept and disbursed by such county

1 from a special fund only for the purposes hereinabove 2 provided.

"(3) Where the use is by a municipality, such use 3 4 shall be for resurfacing, restoration, and rehabilitation of roads, bridges, and streets within the municipality. The use 5 6 may also be for bridge replacement within the municipality. 7 Provided, however, from time to time, that where the use is by a municipality such funds may also be used to construct new 8 roads and streets within such municipality. These funds shall 9 10 not be commingled with other funds of the municipality including any other gasoline tax revenues and shall be kept 11 12 and disbursed by such municipality from a special fund only 13 for the purposes hereinabove provided."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
