26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Effective beginning with the primary election of 2016, before a person may be qualified to vote in a primary election, or a primary runoff election, he or she shall possess all the qualifications required of voters in a regular election. In addition, he or she shall be a registered member of the party in whose primary election he or she seeks to vote and shall have been registered as a member of that party for 90 days immediately preceding the primary election. No person shall be allowed to vote for any party candidate or slate of candidates other than that of the party of which he or she is a registered member. The qualifications shall be determined as of the date of the primary, without regard to the qualifications or disqualifications as they may exist at the succeeding regular election. However, any registered voter, whether registered as a member of a party, political organization, political group, or as an independent, shall be qualified to vote in a primary election for candidates listed in all non-partisan races.

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(b) The Secretary of State may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section.

Section 2. Not later than November 1, 2013, the Secretary of State shall prescribe on the official voter registration application the designation of a political party for the purpose of voting at a primary election.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
