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26		To amend Section 38-2-7 of the Code of Alabama 1975,
27	relating t	to the county boards of human resources; to delete

the provisions for the county board of human resources in a county to appoint the county director of the county departments of human resources and the provision for expenses for board members; and to add Section 38-2-7.1 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide that the director of each county department of human resources would be appointed by the Commissioner of the State Department of Human Resources pursuant to the State Merit System law.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 38-2-7 of the Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

12 "\$38-2-7.

"There is hereby created in each county a county board of human resources, which shall consist of seven members, not less than two of whom shall be women, selected by the county commission from the citizenship of the county on the basis of their recognized interest in the public welfare; provided that in counties in which there are cities having a population of 60,000 or more, according to the last federal census, the city commission or other governing body of the city shall have equal authority with the county commission in selecting the membership of the county board of human resources. No person holding an elective public office, no person who is a candidate for election to a public office, no person who is an employee of the county department of human resources, and no person who is related by consanguinity or affinity within the fourth degree or nearer under the civil

law to any such officer or employee shall be a member of such county board of human resources. The members of said board shall be appointed for a term of six years, and vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as above provided. The county board shall elect from its members a chairman chair and a secretary to serve at its pleasure. The county board shall hold meetings under rules to be established by it in conformity with the regulations of the state board, and such additional meetings as may be called by the chairman chair. The presence of four members at any regular or special meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business. Members of the county board shall serve without compensation for their services as members, but shall be reimbursed for the amount of their traveling and other expenses actually paid out while in attendance at the meetings of the county board or on business of the department.

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"The county board, subject to the provisions of the merit system, shall appoint a county director, who shall be the executive officer of the county department, and the appointment shall be made without regard to political affiliation. The tenure of the county director shall be at the pleasure of the county board. Upon request of the local board, the state personnel department shall establish a county register of eligibles who are residents of the county in which the vacancy exists. If no appointment is made from the local register or there is no local register, then appointment shall be made from the statewide register.

Section 2. Section 38-2-7.1 is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

\$38-2-7.1.

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- (a) The Commissioner of the State Department of Human Resources shall appoint each director of each county department of human resources pursuant to the State Merit System law. The commissioner may request the State Personnel Department to establish a county register of eligibles who are residents of the county in which a vacancy exists or the commissioner may request a statewide register to fill a vacancy.
- (b) Any director of a county department of human resources on the effective date of this section shall serve in an acting capacity until a county director for the county department is appointed pursuant to subsection (a).

Section 3. This act shall become effective October 1, 2013.
