5 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited 6 as the Welfare Cap Act.

Section 2. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an applicant or recipient of funds provided by the federal government under the TANF block grant shall receive temporary cash assistance for no more than the following:

(1) A lifetime cumulative total of 48 months for an
applicant first receiving benefits on or after October 1,
2012, and prior to October 1, 2013.

14 (2) A lifetime cumulative total of 36 months for an
15 applicant first receiving benefits on or after October 1,
16 2013.

(b) Hardship exemptions to the time limitations provided in this section shall be limited to 20 percent of the average monthly caseload, as determined by the Department of Human Resources. The department shall establish the criteria and procedure for approving hardship exemptions.

(c) Temporary cash assistance received under a block
grant program that provided temporary assistance for needy
families in any other state shall count towards the cumulative
benefit limit for temporary cash assistance received in this
state.

(d) Child-only cases are not subject to time
 limitations and temporary cash assistance received while an
 individual is a minor shall not count towards the time
 limitation.

5 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 6 first day of the third month following its passage and 7 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
