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19	To create the Alabama Sales, Use, and Lease Tax
20	Simplification Task Force, to study the issue of streamlining
21	and simplifying the administration and remittance of sales,
22	use, and lease taxes; and to provide for its membership and
23	purposes.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. The Legislature finds that the State of
26	Alabama's requirement of separate tax returns causes a

significant compliance burden for many taxpayers and provides no beneficial impact on our economy.

Section 2. (a) The Alabama Sales, Use, and Lease Tax Simplification Task Force is hereby established to study the issue of streamlining and simplifying the administration and remittance of sales, use, and lease taxes.

- (b) The Alabama Sales, Use, and Lease Tax
  Simplification Task Force shall be composed of the following
  members:
  - (1) The Director of the Department of Finance.
  - (2) The Commissioner of the Department of Revenue.
- (3) Two state-licensed attorneys having specialization in tax law, one to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and one to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- (4) Three executive officers appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, with one officer presiding over a small business employing 50 or fewer employees, one officer presiding over a medium-sized business employing between 51 and 250 employees, and one officer presiding over a corporation employing more than 250 employees.
- (5) Three executive officers appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, with one officer presiding over a small business employing 50 or fewer employees, one officer presiding over a medium-sized business employing between 51 and 250 employees, and one officer

- presiding over a corporation employing more than 250 employees.
- 3 (6) Two members of the House of Representatives
  4 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 5 (7) Two members of the Senate appointed by the 6 President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- 7 (8) Two citizens of the state appointed at-large, 8 one by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and one by 9 the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- 10 (9) One person appointed by the Alabama League of 11 Municipalities.
  - (10) One person appointed by the Association of County Commissions of Alabama.
- 14 (11) One person appointed by the Association of
  15 Alabama Tax Administrators.

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- 16 (12) One person appointed by the Business Council of
  Alabama.
  - (c) Appointment and selection of members of the task force shall be made within 30 days following passage of this act.
  - (d) The task force shall hold its first meeting at a time and place as directed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives within 60 days following passage of this act. At the first meeting, the task force shall elect from its members a chair and a vice-chair. Thereafter, the task force shall meet at the call of the chair or at the call of a majority of the members.

- 1 (e) Each legislative member of the task force shall 2 be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or 3 4 she attends a meeting of the task force, which shall be paid out of any funds appropriated for the use of the Legislature, 5 6 upon warrants drawn by the Comptroller, upon requisitions 7 signed by the task force chair. Legislative members may not receive additional legislative compensation or per diem for a 8 regular or special session meeting day or committee meeting 9 10 day of any special or regular session, or if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance on 11 12 other state business. Non-legislative members of the task force may be reimbursed according to the policies and 13 14 procedures of the respective agencies and groups represented.
  - (f) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate may, as necessary, appoint House and Senate staff members to provide assistance to the task force.
  - (g) The membership of the task force shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.

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(h) The task force, in all respects, shall be subject to the Alabama Open Meetings Act, Title 36, Chapter 25A, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 3. The task force shall complete its study and make a written report of its findings and suggestions to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President

- Pro Tempore of the Senate by the third legislative day of the
  2 2013 Regular Session, at which time the task force shall stand
  3 dissolved and discharged of any further duties and
  4 liabilities.
  5 Section 4. The expenses of the task force may not
  6 exceed \$1,000.
  7 Section 5. This act shall become effective
- 8 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or 9 its otherwise becoming law.
