134910-2:n:01/20/2012:JET/tan LRS2011-5360R1 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 SYNOPSIS: This bill would provide a four percent 8 cost-of-living salary increase for certain state 9 10 and public education employees in the fiscal year 11 beginning October 1, 2012. 12 This bill would provide that the four 13 percent cost-of-living salary increase would be 14 contingent upon the passage and enactment of House Bill which would require taxpayers who are part 15 16 of a unitary business to use a combined report to 17 determine their Alabama taxable income, limit the 18 Alabama deductions by corporations to seven percent 19 of qualifying income, and 50 percent of the 20 adjusted basis of qualified property. Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 21 22 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the 23 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 24 Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general 25 law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from 26 27 becoming effective with regard to a local

1governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote2unless: it comes within one of a number of3specified exceptions; it is approved by the4affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates5funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to6the entity for the purpose.

7 The purpose or effect of this bill would be 8 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. If this 9 10 bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not 11 become effective with regard to a local entity 12 unless approved by the local entity or until, and 13 only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds 14 or provides for a local source of revenue.

> A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

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To provide for a four percent cost-of-living salary 20 21 increase for certain state and public education employees in 22 the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2012; to provide for a 23 revision of the State Minimum Salary Schedule and to reflect 24 pay increases of four percent in the fiscal year beginning 25 October 1, 2012; to provide that each certificated employee of certain boards of education shall receive the pay increase 26 27 according to placement on the appropriate salary step and in

1 addition to the salary earned during the previous year; to 2 require the appropriate increases on the State Minimum Salary Schedule; to provide support employees with a four percent 3 4 cost-of-living adjustment; to provide the employees of other public educational institutions and schools with a four 5 6 percent cost-of-living adjustment; to provide for an 7 across-the-board salary increase of all two-year postsecondary salary schedules, and to establish other requirements on the 8 9 two-year postsecondary salary schedules; to provide that the 10 four percent cost-of-living salary increase would be 11 contingent upon the passage and enactment of House Bill 12 which would require taxpayers who are part of a unitary 13 business to use a combined report to determine their Alabama 14 taxable income, limit the Alabama deductions by corporations 15 to seven percent of qualifying income, and 50 percent of the adjusted basis of qualified property; and in connection 16 17 therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the 18 meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 19 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official 20 21 Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as 22 amended.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Beginning with the first payday on or after October 1, 2012, all state employees who are listed in the classified and unclassified service of the state as defined in Section 36-26-10, Code of Alabama 1975, and all

1 other state employees and hourly employees of the state, and 2 all legislative personnel, officers, and employees, including, but not limited to, Legislative Reference Service personnel, 3 4 whether subject to the state Merit System or not, and all employees of the county health departments who are employed 5 6 subject to the state Merit System and whose compensation is 7 paid out of a budget provided and agreed upon by the state, county, or other contributing agency under the direction of 8 the State Board of Health, except those set out in subsection 9 10 (b), shall receive a four percent salary increase.

(b) Any salary increase granted under this section shall not apply to elected officials, including but not limited to, legislators, judges, and executive branch officers. The salary increase granted under this section shall not apply to, or increase the compensation of, any local employee whose salary is tied to that of any state employee.

(c) The salary increase granted under this section
shall not apply to any Merit System employee or hourly
employee whose service or rate of pay is covered by any labor
agreement or contract.

(d) The Director of the State Personnel Department shall revise the schedule of rates set forth in the pay plan for state employees and shall certify the same to the state Comptroller, who shall issue warrants in accordance therewith. With respect to all court officials and employees within the Unified Judicial System who serve the trial and appellate courts of the state and the Administrative Office of Courts,

the Administrative Director of Courts shall revise the 1 2 schedule of rates set forth in the pay plan for these court officials and employees to reflect the increase provided in 3 4 this act, and shall certify the same to the state Comptroller, who shall issue warrants in accordance therewith. With respect 5 to the legislative employees, the Secretary of the Senate for 6 7 employees of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of Representatives for employees of the House of Representatives, 8 the Director of the Legislative Reference Service for 9 employees of the Legislative Reference Service, and the 10 Director of the Legislative Fiscal Office for employees of the 11 12 Legislative Fiscal Office, shall revise the schedule of rates 13 set forth in the pay plan for these legislative employees to 14 reflect the increase provided in this act, and shall certify the same to the state Comptroller, who shall issue warrants in 15 accordance therewith. 16

17 Section 2. PAY INCREASES, FY 2012-2013. (a) The State Budget Officer shall allocate to the State Board of 18 Education, the Board of Trustees of the Alabama Institute for 19 Deaf and Blind, the Board of Youth Services School District, 20 21 the Board of Directors of the Alabama School of Fine Arts, and 22 the Board of Trustees of the Alabama School of Mathematics and 23 Science for disbursement to the employees thereof funds based 24 on the criteria established in this act.

(1) Certificated personnel (K-12). For the fiscal
 year beginning October 1, 2012, and each year thereafter, each
 certificated employee at all city and county school systems

and the teachers at the Department of Youth Services School District shall receive a four percent salary increase. Each step and cell on the State Minimum Salary Schedule contained in the annual budget section for the public schools shall be increased by the amounts below for the fiscal year 2012-2013, the State Minimum Salary Schedule shall reflect the following percentage increases:

(2) All certificated employees, including Adult
Basic Education and Science in Motion employees, shall be
guaranteed pay increases in the amounts indicated above for
their years of experience and degrees earned, and the
corresponding pay increases shall be reflected in the
appropriate local salary schedule and paid to each
certificated employee. The provisions and requirements of this

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1 section shall be in addition to the provisions of Section 2 16-13-231.1, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the State Minimum Salary Schedule. Each certificated employee shall be 3 4 properly placed on the local salary schedule according to degree earned and years of public education service, either 5 6 in-state or out-of-state, which shall be not less than the 7 amounts appropriated for the State Minimum Salary Schedule. The employee shall be paid according to degree earned and 8 length of public education experience. The pay increase shall 9 10 be given to each person employed for the 2012-2013 fiscal year in addition to any state or local step increase to which the 11 12 employee is otherwise entitled. The local board of education 13 shall transmit to the State Department of Education the 14 appropriate notice of the earned advanced degree for each 15 employee in a timely fashion; thereafter, the employee shall be paid for the advanced degree as soon as the degree is 16 17 certified to the State Department of Education as being earned. 18

(3) Education support personnel (K-12). A four 19 20 percent salary increase shall be paid to each public education 21 support worker and adult bus driver, including Adult Basic 22 Education and Science in Motion personnel, employed for the 23 2012-2013 fiscal year in addition to the salary received 24 during the 2011-2012 fiscal year, except employees covered 25 under the state's Merit System at the Department of Youth Services District. Each governing body of authority shall 26 27 establish and maintain a salary schedule for each class and

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1 type of employee and each step of each salary schedule shall 2 be increased to reflect a four percent pay increase which shall be given to the person employed for the 2012-2013 fiscal 3 4 year and each year employed thereafter. A separate salary schedule shall be established and maintained for each job. No 5 6 salary increase or state-provided fringe benefits for any 7 lunchroom worker shall be paid from lunchroom sales or from any other aspect of the Child Nutrition Program. Salary 8 9 increases provided herein and state-provided fringe benefits 10 are funded from the annual budget act for the public schools and shall not be taken from the Child Nutrition Program. 11

(4) AIDB. For the fiscal year 2012-2013, employees at the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind shall receive pay increases which shall be in excess of their salaries received during the 2011-2012 fiscal year. The increases shall be as follows:

a. Certificated. The salary schedule for certificated employees shall be revised to reflect at least the following amount of raises:

b. Support. A four percent salary increase shall begiven to each support worker employed.

c. Miscellaneous requirements. The board shall 6 7 establish and maintain a salary schedule for each class and type of employee and each step of each salary schedule shall 8 9 be increased to reflect the pay increases above which shall be given to each person employed for the 2012-2013 fiscal year 10 and each year employed thereafter. The raises contained in 11 12 this subsection shall be paid to each employee. A separate 13 salary schedule shall be established and maintained for each 14 job and position.

15 (5) Two-year postsecondary institutions. The State 16 Board of Education shall revise all salary schedules of the 17 two-year postsecondary institutions to reflect an increase of 18 three percent for the 2012-2013 fiscal year. The pay increases 19 shall be given to each person employed in addition to any step 20 increase to which the employee is otherwise entitled. The Postsecondary Education Department shall take proper steps to 21 ensure that employees on all salary schedules are given full 22 23 credit for prior work experience in the public schools and 24 colleges, and shall take care to ensure proper placements on 25 the salary schedules. Placement on the revised salary

schedules shall be in accordance with the employee's length of service in public education. No pay increase shall be given to any two-year postsecondary employee in excess of three percent, except as specifically provided in this section. Every employee on Salary Schedules C-3 shall receive at least a three percent COLA.

7 (6) Miscellaneous provisions. The following8 provisions are hereby established:

9 a. Fiscal year. All salaries and salary increases 10 which are established by the Legislature or authorized by the 11 State Board of Education shall be paid in full to each person 12 employed before the end of the applicable fiscal year as 13 defined in Section 16-1-1 of the Code of Alabama of 1975, as 14 amended.

b. Extended work. Public school employees on
contracts which extend beyond 182 days shall be given a pro
rata salary increment for each day or partial day of work
extending beyond 182 days.

c. Local increment. Any cost-of-living adjustment or 19 increase on the State Minimum Salary Schedule for teachers as 20 21 provided in this act shall be exclusive of any local pay 22 increase granted or due to teachers under provisions of the 23 local salary schedule. Any cost-of-living adjustment or pay 24 increase required by this act for public school support 25 personnel shall be in addition to any pay increase granted or 26 due to the employees under provisions of the local salary 27 schedules. The pay raise provisions of this act shall not

apply to the federal portion of the salary paid to a Junior
 Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) instructor employed by
 a local school board.

d. Reduced pay. No employee shall be dismissed or
have his or her work hours reduced or extended or have his or
her salary reduced due to the provisions of any pay raise
required by the Legislature or by the State Board of
Education.

9 e. Community education. Each county and city board 10 of education shall have the option to exclude from the 11 provisions of this act any community education or 12 school-sponsored child care or child enrichment program which 13 is supplemental to the state-required educational program.

14 f. Local chief executive officers. The pay raise 15 provisions of this act shall not apply to superintendents of 16 education of any school system. Any pay increase given to the 17 superintendent shall be by recorded vote of the governing 18 board of authority.

g. Career technical programs. There shall be no 19 cutbacks or decreases in the Career Technical Programs of any 20 21 board as a result of this or any preceding pay raise act of 22 the Legislature. Neither the salaries nor the number of career 23 technical employee positions are to be reduced or diminished 24 in any manner or method as a result of the passage of this act 25 or any prior act after the 1995 fiscal year granting pay 26 increase to any employee of the board. It shall be strictly 27 prohibited for any board or chief executive officer to take

1 monies from the Career Technical Program to finance, in whole 2 or in part, the programs or the salaries of the employees in 3 the Career Technical Program of the board, and the State Board 4 of Education shall take care to protect the viability of the 5 Career Technical Program of each board.

6 h. Anniversary date of employment. The employee 7 shall be placed on the appropriate salary schedule according 8 to length of service and degree earned as contained in this 9 act. The length of employment shall include both in-state and 10 out-of-state years of public education experience. Placement 11 on the salary schedule shall be calculated according to the 12 anniversary date of employment.

13 Section 3. The granting of the additional four 14 percent cost-of-living salary increase is conditioned upon the passage and enactment of House Bill which would require 15 taxpayers who are part of a unitary business to use a combined 16 17 report to determine their Alabama taxable income, limit the Alabama deductions by corporations to seven percent of 18 19 qualifying income, and 50 percent of the adjusted basis of 20 qualified property.

21 Section 4. Although this bill would have as its 22 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 23 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 24 requirements and application under Amendment 621 because the 25 bill requires expenditures only by a school board.

26 Section 5. All laws or parts of laws which conflict 27 with this act are repealed. Section 6. The provisions of this act are severable. If any part of this act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part which remains.

5 Section 7. This act shall become effective 6 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or 7 its otherwise becoming law.
