26	Chapter 21 of Title 36, Code of Alabama 1975, an annual fee of
27	three dollars (\$3) may be voluntarily added to every property

1 and casualty insurance policy issued or renewed in the state 2 by indicating on a checkoff box which shall be provided on the policy billing. If a policy holder voluntarily so indicates, 3 4 three dollars (\$3), less an administration fee not to exceed three percent of revenues remitted to the fund shall be added 5 6 to the policy premium due. The net amounts after 7 administration fees are deducted by the insurance company issuing the policy shall be distributed by the property or 8 9 casualty insurance issuer to the Alabama Firefighters Annuity 10 and Benefit Fund on a quarterly basis between the first and fifteenth of January, April, July, and October of each year. 11

(b) The net amount of all fees shall be remitted by the person or authority collecting the same to the executive director of the fund on the tenth day of each month next succeeding that in which the fee is paid.

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective 17 immediately following its passage and approval by the 18 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
