24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. The following amendment to the
26	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and
27	shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a

majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- (a) Citizens may propose new general law and may propose amendments to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, by the initiative.
- (b) Citizens may propose the repeal of existing general law by the referendum.
 - (c) In order to qualify an initiative or referendum petition, the following shall occur:
 - (1) A preliminary version of the proposed petition shall be filed with the Secretary of State.
 - (2) The Secretary of State shall review the petition language and certify that the petition conforms to all requirements of this amendment and any enabling legislation.
 - (3) The Attorney General shall prepare the title and language of the initiative or referendum.
 - (d) An initiative petition to propose to add or amend general law or a referendum provision to repeal existing law shall contain signatures of a number of registered voters totaling at least five percent of the votes cast in the most recent general gubernatorial election.
 - (e) An initiative petition calling for a constitutional amendment shall contain signatures of registered voters totaling at least 10 percent of the votes cast in the most recent general gubernatorial election.

1 (f) No more than 25 percent of the total signatures 2 for an initiative or referendum petition may be of residents of any one county. 3 4 (g) The Secretary of State shall verify receipt of a sufficient number of registered voters' signatures to qualify 5 an initiative or referendum. 6 7 (h) An initiative or referendum that qualifies shall be placed on the next statewide general election ballot that 8 occurs 90 days or more after the Secretary of State has 9 10 approved the petition. (i) The Legislature may enact general law consistent 11 12 with this amendment to implement this amendment. 13 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 14 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 15 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 16 17 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state. 18 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 19 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 20 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 21 22 following description of the substance or subject matter of 23 the proposed constitutional amendment: 24 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 25 Alabama of 1901, to provide a procedure of initiative and

referendum in which electors may propose legislation.

"Proposed by Act ."

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This description shall be followed by the following language:

"Yes () No ()."
