Relating to timely filing of a report of contribution and expenditures by candidates; to provide for the Honest Campaign Act of 2012; to provide that a candidate who does not timely file a report of contribution and expenditures to the Alabama Secretary of State shall be subject to a fine for each day past the deadline that the report is due; and to provide that the Alabama Secretary of State shall assess a fee for each candidate who is required to file an amended report of contribution and expenditures.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the Honest Campaign Act of 2012.

Section 2. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any candidate who does not timely file a report of contributions and expenditures to the Alabama Secretary of State shall be subject to a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100) for each day past the deadline that the report is due.

- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Alabama Secretary of State shall collect a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100) for each candidate who is required to file an amended report of contribution and expenditures.
- (c) The provisions of this act shall become operative at the next election cycle after the effective date of this act.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
