The following amendment to the 9 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and 10 shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a 11 majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in 12 accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution 13 of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

14 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Section 65 of Article IV of the Constitution ofAlabama of 1901, is amended to read as follows:

"Section 65.

"The legislature Except as provided in Part II of 19 this section, the Legislature shall have no power to authorize 20 21 lotteries or gift enterprises for any purposes, and shall pass 22 laws to prohibit the sale in this state of lottery or gift 23 enterprise tickets, or tickets in any scheme in the nature of 24 a lottery; and all acts, or parts of acts heretofore passed by 25 the legislature Legislature of this state, authorizing a 26 lottery or lotteries, and all acts amendatory thereof, or 27 supplemental thereto, are hereby avoided.

2	" <u>(a) Establishment of an Alabama Lottery.</u>
3	"The Legislature shall provide for the establishment
4	and regulation of an Alabama Lottery.
5	"(b) Replacement of Existing Education Funds
6	Prohibited.
7	"Funds deposited into the Education Trust Fund
8	pursuant to subsection (e) may not be used in any manner to

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 9 10 Alabama of 1901, to establish an Alabama Lottery; to create an 11 Alabama Lottery Corporation to regulate and administer the 12 lottery; to allocate the expenditure of the proceeds to general fund and education purposes; to allow the Legislature 13 14 to implement the Alabama Lottery through appropriate general 15 law; and to terminate the lottery and the Alabama Lottery Corporation after a specified period of time." 16
