5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

6 Section 1. Section 41-16-20 of the Code of Alabama 7 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§41-16-20.

"(a) With the exception of contracts for public 9 works whose competitive bidding requirements are governed 10 exclusively by Title 39, all contracts of whatever nature for 11 12 labor, services, work, or for the purchase or lease of 13 materials, equipment, supplies, other personal property or 14 other nonprofessional services, involving seven thousand five 15 hundred dollars (\$7,500) or more, made by or on behalf of any state department, board, bureau, commission, committee, 16 17 institution, corporation, authority, or office shall, except as otherwise provided in this article, be let by free and open 18 competitive bidding, on sealed bids, to the lowest responsible 19 bidder. 20

21 "(b) A "preferred vendor" shall be a person, firm, 22 or corporation which is granted preference priority according 23 to the following:

24 "(1) PRIORITY #1. Produces or manufactures the25 product within the state.

"(2) PRIORITY #2. Has an assembly plant or
 distribution facility for the product within the state.

"(3) PRIORITY #3. Is organized for business under
the applicable laws of the state as a corporation,
partnership, or professional association and has maintained at
least one retail outlet or service center for the product or
service within the state for not less than one year prior to
the deadline date for the competitive bid.

7 "(c) In the event a bid is received for the product or service from a person, firm, or corporation deemed to be a 8 responsible bidder and a preferred vendor where any state 9 10 department, board, bureau, commission, committee, institution, corporation, authority, or office is the awarding authority 11 12 and the bid is no more than five percent greater than the bid 13 of the lowest responsible bidder, the awarding authority may 14 award the contract to the preferred vendor.

15 "(d) In addition to the aforementioned preferred
16 vendors, each small business certified under the federal
17 HUBZone program shall be a preferred vendor with #1 preference
18 priority status on all contracts awarded by the state for
19 state agencies and departments. A full and open competition
20 contract may be awarded if the HUBZone small business is not
21 more than five percent higher."

22 Section 2. Each small business certified under the 23 HUBZone program to receive from the state any benefit which 24 the federal government offers to such business if the state 25 grants such a benefit to other businesses. Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
