Section 22-9A-11.1 is added to the Code 8 9 of Alabama 1975, to read as follows: 10 \$22-9A-11.1. All laws or parts of laws which conflict 4 5 with this act are repealed. Section 4. This act shall become effective on the 6 7 first day of the third month following its passage and 8 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
