To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated 9 from the named funds for the 2012-2013 fiscal year to the 10 state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the 11 expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all 12 monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of 13 the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

20 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total21 of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or 1 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended 2 only for such purposes.

3 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 4 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 5 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 6 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 7 expended only for such purposes.

8 "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the 9 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations 10 of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

14 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 15 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the 16 executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 17 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for 18 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013, 19 to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 20 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much 21 thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-22 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 23 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as 24 provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 25 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-

ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay date falls.

Each quarter's appropriation to the Department of Economic and Community Affairs is contingent upon the receipt of the previous quarter's report. The Director of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs shall notify all members of the local legislative delegation five days prior to the announcement of any grant made to any entity located in the legislative jurisdiction. The five days prior notice requirement shall be waived in the event of a declared emergency. prosthetic, orthotic and/or pedorthic practitioner in the State of Alabama practicing at an accredited facility. vices approving such a plan and (2) no increase in the use of state matching funds for Medicaid non-emergency transportation services provided under the Medical Transportation Program in Alabama. By October 1, 2012, the Medicaid Agency shall report to the Chair of the Senate Committee on Finance and Taxation General Fund, the Chair of the House Committee on Ways and Means General Fund, and the Medicaid Oversight Commission information regarding the agency's current rebates for generic drugs. In fiscal year 2013, the agency shall engage in obtaining increased rebates for generic drugs. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, to the various state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted on September 30, 2012, are hereby reappropriated to the respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2012.

2 Section 9. Except as may be herein otherwise 3 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law 4 5 for such purposes.  commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that
 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

Section 11. In addition to appropriations herein 4 5 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in the bill, 6 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 7 8 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 9 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 10 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 11 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 12 13 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 14 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 15 16 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 17 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 18 19 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 20 said agency. Such appropriations are 6 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 7 8 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination 9 10 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 11 not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 13. All interest earned from funds paid into 12 13 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 14 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 15 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 16 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 17 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 18 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd 19 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 20 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

Section 14. All encumbered balances of a previous fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately following the fiscal year for which the

appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the
 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the

10 Section 19. In the appropriation in this Act to the 11 Alabama Department of Public Health, the reference to Prostate 12 Screening and Research refers to research performed at the 13 Mitchell Cancer Institute, at the University of Alabama at 14 Birmingham, and at the University of Alabama at Birmingham 15 (Huntsville Hospital).

16 Section 20. The appropriations made herein to the 17 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 18 the amounts necessary to pay the State Employee Health 19 Insurance Board (SEIB). The SEIB rate shall be \$765 per month 20 for each full-time employee for the fiscal year ending 21 September 30, 2013. The State Employees' Insurance Board will 22 adjust the insurance program wherever appropriate to maintain 23 the aforementioned fixed rate. For the fiscal year 2013, the 24 Governor upon the recommendation of the State Director of 25 Finance, shall have the authority to increase the SEIB monthly

employer insurance premium rate up to a maximum of \$805 per month for each full-time employee.

3 Section 21. It is the intent of the Legislature that 4 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 5 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 6 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the 7 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of 8 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds 9 appropriated in this act.
