One member who has been certified by the 12 National Water Well Association Certification 13 Program. This bill would provide that the member has 14 been certified by the National Water Well 15 16 Association Certification Program, or its 17 successor, the National Ground Water Association, 18 or may be a hydrogeologist or geologist licensed to 19 practice geology in the State of Alabama. 20 Existing law provides that no member may 21 serve no more than a total of 18 years. 22 This bill would limit commission members appointed on or after July 1, 2012, to two terms 23 24 and would provide exceptions. 25 26 A BILL 27 TO BE ENTITLED

4	Commission; to amend Section 22-22A-6 of the Code of Alabama
5	1975, relating to the membership of the commission, to provide
6	that the member previously required to have been certified by
7	the National Water Well Association Certification Program must
8	be certified at anytime by the National Ground Water
9	Association Certification Program, or may be a hydrogeologist
10	or geologist licensed to practice geology in the State of
11	Alabama; and to further provide for the term of office and to
12	provide exceptions.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 22-22A-6 of the Code of Alabama
15	1975, is amended to read as follows:
16	"§22-22A-6.
17	"(a) There is hereby created a seven member
18	Environmental Management Commission of the Alabama Department
19	of Environmental Management which shall have the following
20	duties:
21	"(1) To select a director for the Department of
22	Environmental Management and to advise the director on
23	environmental matters which are within the department's scope
24	of authority;
25	"(2) To establish, adopt, promulgate, modify, repeal
26	and suspend any rules, regulations or environmental standards

1 for the department which may be applicable to the state as a
2 whole or any of its geographical parts;

3 "(3) To develop environmental policy for the state; 4 and

5 "(4) To hear and determine appeals of administrative 6 actions.

7 "(b) The Environmental Management Commission shall be composed of seven members who are citizens of the State of 8 9 Alabama. Initial members of the commission shall be appointed 10 to places on the Environmental Management Commission by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Speaker of the House of 11 12 Representatives pursuant to the procedure set out in 13 subsection (d) (e) of this section with the advice and consent 14 of the Senate. Initial appointments shall be made on or before 15 October 1, 1982. All subsequent appointments to places on the 16 Environmental Management Commission after the initial 17 appointments shall be made by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. No member of the Environmental 18 Management Commission appointed before July 1, 2012, may serve 19 more than a total of 18 years. Any member of the commission 20 21 appointed on or after July 1, 2012, shall serve no more than two terms. The two term limitation shall not apply to a member 22 23 who serves during the unexpired term of his or her predecessor 24 or who serves until his or her successor is appointed with the 25 advice and consent of the Senate. When a vacancy occurs during a period when the Legislature is not in session to advise and 26 27 consent, such appointee shall have the full power of the

office until and unless the Senate, upon the reconvening of the Legislature, shall by affirmative vote refuse to consent in such appointment. Qualifications of the seven members shall be as follows:

5 "(1) One member shall be a physician licensed to 6 practice medicine in the State of Alabama and shall be 7 familiar with environmental matters;

8 "(2) One member shall be a professional engineer 9 registered in the State of Alabama and shall be familiar with 10 environmental matters;

"(3) One member shall be an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Alabama and shall be familiar with environmental matters;

14 "(4) One member shall be a chemist possessing as a 15 minimum a bachelor's degree from an accredited university or a 16 veterinarian licensed to practice veterinary medicine in the 17 State of Alabama and shall be familiar with environmental 18 matters;

"(5) One member that who has been certified at any 19 time by the National Water Well Association Certification 20 21 Program, or its successor, the National Ground Water Association, or who is <u>a hydrogeologist</u> or geologist, as that 22 23 term is defined in subdivision (2) of Section 34-41-3, 24 licensed to practice geology in the State of Alabama or 25 specifically exempted from licensing under subdivision (1) of 26 subsection (b) of Section 34-41-7 and who shall be familiar 27 with environmental matters;

1 "(6) One member shall be a biologist or an ecologist
2 possessing as a minimum a bachelor's degree <u>in biology or</u>
3 <u>ecology</u> from an accredited university and shall have training
4 <u>in be familiar with</u> environmental matters; and
5 "(7) One member shall be a resident of the state for

at least two years but shall not be required to have any
specialized experience.

8 "(c) The membership of the commission shall be 9 inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, 10 urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state. The 11 commission shall annually report to the Legislature by the 12 second legislative day of each regular session the extent to 13 which the commission has complied with the diversity 14 provisions provided for in this subsection.

15 "(c) (d) At the expiration of the terms of all 16 members initially appointed, their successors shall be 17 promptly appointed by the Governor for terms of six years. At 18 the expiration of a term of office or in the event of a vacancy on the Environmental Management Commission, the 19 Governor shall promptly make an appointment to fill the 20 21 vacancy. The expiring term of an incumbent member shall be 22 continued until an appointment is made.

"(d) (e) Provided however that the The initial
appointments to the Environmental Management Commission shall
be made as follows notwithstanding the other provisions of
this chapter:

"(1) The Governor shall appoint three members of the
Environmental Management Commission, two of whom shall come
from the voting members of the boards or commissions abolished
by this chapter. The Governor's three initial appointments
shall fill the positions described in subdivisions (4), (6)
and (7) of subsection (b) of this section. The terms of these
initial position appointments shall be for six years.

"(2) The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint two 8 9 members of the Environmental Management Commission, one who 10 shall come from the voting members of the boards or commissions abolished by this chapter. The Lieutenant 11 12 Governor's appointments pursuant to this subsection shall fill the positions described in subdivisions (1) and (5) of 13 14 subsection (b) of this section. The term of the initial 15 position described in subdivision (1) of subsection (b) of this section shall be for four years. The term of the initial 16 17 position described in subdivision (5) of subsection (b) of this section shall be for two years. 18

"(3) The Speaker of the House of Representatives 19 shall appoint two members of the Environmental Management 20 21 Commission, one who shall come from the voting members of the 22 boards or commissions abolished by this chapter. The Speaker 23 of the House of Representatives' appointments pursuant to this 24 subsection shall fill the positions described in subdivisions 25 (2) and (3) of subsection (b) of this section. The term of the 26 initial position described in subdivision (2) of subsection 27 (b) of this section shall be for four years. The term of the

initial position described in subdivision (3) of subsection
 (b) of this section shall be for two years.

"(e) (f) The Environmental Management Commission 3 shall select a chairman from among its members, and the 4 chairman's term of office shall be determined by the 5 Environmental Management Commission, but shall not exceed 6 7 three consecutive years. The Environmental Management Commission shall not take official action unless a quorum is 8 9 present. A quorum shall be any four of the seven members. 10 Recusal of a member shall not affect the quorum.

11 "(f) (g) The Environmental Management Commission 12 shall meet regularly, at least once every two months at times 13 and places to be fixed by the Environmental Management 14 Commission. Special meetings may be called at the discretion of the chairman of the Environmental Management Commission and 15 16 special meetings shall be called by him on written request of 17 any four members to take up any matters within the jurisdiction of the Environmental Management Commission. All 18 members shall be notified of the time and place of any regular 19 20 or special meeting in any one of the following ways: in 21 writing or by telegram to a member's last known address as 22 provided to the department or by telephone.

23 "(g) (h) Any member of the Environmental Management 24 Commission who misses three consecutive regularly scheduled 25 meetings, shall immediately cease to be a member of the 26 commission and the Governor shall promptly appoint a new

member with appropriate qualifications to fill the remainder
 of the term.

3 "(h) (i) The Environmental Management Commission 4 shall keep a complete and accurate record of the proceedings 5 of all its meetings, a copy of which shall be kept on file in 6 the office of the director and open to public inspection.

7 "(i) (j) (1) Each member shall receive \$100.00 per 8 day for each day of attendance at an official meeting. Members 9 of the Environmental Management Commission shall be reimbursed 10 for expenses when attending meetings which are approved and 11 certified by the director. Reimbursement shall be in 12 accordance with Sections 36-7-1 through 36-7-42;

"(2) All proper expenses of the Environmental
Management Commission shall be paid from the appropriations to
or funds of the department in the same manner as expenses of
the department are paid.

17 "(j) (k) Members of the Environmental Management 18 Commission shall meet all requirements of the state ethics law 19 and the conflict of interest provisions of applicable federal 20 laws and regulations."

21 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 22 first day of the third month following its passage and 23 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
