## TO BE ENTITLED

6 AN ACT

To exempt certain community programs under contract with the Department of Mental Health from regulation by the Board of Nursing in the storage, handling, and administration of medications and other substances to meet the needs of the participants.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) For purposes of this act, the term "community program" means a community program that is under contract with the Department of Mental Health to provide services to persons with intellectual disabilities may provide for the storage, handling, and administration of medications and other substances to meet the needs of participants in the program.

(b) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the storage, handling, and administration of medications and other medical needs by a person working in community programs as defined in subsection (a) are exempt from regulation by the Board of Nursing.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
