BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 26-14-2 of the Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"(a) In order to protect children whose health and welfare may be adversely affected through abuse and neglect, the legislature hereby provides for the reporting of such cases to the appropriate authorities. It is the intent of the legislature that, as a result of such efforts, and through the cooperation of state, county, local agencies and divisions of government, protective services shall be made available in an effort to prevent further abuses and neglect, to safeguard and enforce the general welfare of such children, and to encourage cooperation among the states in dealing with the problems of child abuse.

"(b) The existence of a mental, physical, or developmental disability, or any other disability as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. \$12131(2) of the parent or guardian shall not in and of itself be considered child abuse or neglect.

"(c) This chapter shall not be construed to authorize interference with the rearing of a child, including

3	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
4	first day of the third month following its passage and
5	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
