BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

No elected or appointed Cullman County official or sheriff may assume a supernumerary office after the effective date of this amendment. Any person who, on the effective date of this amendment, is entitled to participate in a supernumerary program may continue to participate in that supernumerary program, which shall include the assumption of a supernumerary office according to the terms and conditions of the law which established that supernumerary program. Every elected or appointed Cullman County official may participate in the Employees' Retirement System of Alabama upon the same terms and conditions as may be specified by law for any other employee in the same retirement system, and shall be treated as an employee of the county. Cullman County officials holding office at the time of the ratification of this amendment shall be eligible to purchase service credit in the Employees' Retirement System for the time the official has served in the current office. No person may participate in both a supernumerary program and the Employees' Retirement System based on the same service. For the purposes of this amendment,

1 the words "elected or appointed Cullman County official" shall 2 include any person appointed to serve the remaining term of an elected or appointed Cullman County official. The words do not 3 include a judge, county commissioner, district attorney, legislator, constable, school board member, or any official 5 6 elected from a judicial circuit. 7 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held at the 2012 General Election in accordance with 8 Amendment 555 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now 9 10 appearing as Section 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the 11 12 election laws of this state. 13 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 14 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 15 following description of the substance or subject matter of 16 17 the proposed constitutional amendment: "Relating to Cullman County, proposing an amendment 18 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to phase out the 19 supernumerary system for certain public officials and allow 20 21 elected or appointed county officials, as defined, to 22 participate in the Employees' Retirement System. "Proposed by Act " 23 24 This description shall be followed by the following 25 language:
