2 Relating to occupational and license tax; to allow a county which has levied an occupational and license tax in the 3 4 20 years prior to the enactment of this act to reimpose the tax on the same terms and conditions as it was previously 5 6 imposed if there is a public university in the county that 7 operates a medical school; and to provide that 20 percent of the proceeds from the occupational and license tax would be 8 transferred to the university to be used for scientific, 9 10 medical, and innovative research projects or construction projects for the university. 11

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. (a) A county which has levied an occupational and license tax in the 20 years prior to the enactment of this act may reimpose the tax on the same terms and conditions as it was previously imposed if there is a public university in the county that operates a medical school.

(b) Twenty percent of the proceeds from the tax
shall be transferred to the university to be used for
scientific, medical, and innovative research projects or
construction projects and the balance shall be distributed to
the county general fund.

24 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 25 first day of the third month following its passage and 26 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
