BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

## PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 264 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended by Amendment 399 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 264 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, there is created a separate Board of Trustees for the University of Alabama at Birmingham and a separate Board of Trustees for the University of Alabama at Huntsville, each of which shall be responsible for the management and control of the respective university.

Section 2. (a) (1) a. Each board of trustees shall consist of 12 members, two members who shall reside in the congressional district in which the institution is situated; one member shall reside in each of the remaining congressional districts in the state as constituted on January 1, 2013, and shall be a bona fide resident and qualified elector of that

1 district, with a verifiable physical presence in that 2 district, during the entire term of office; three at-large members who may be selected from outside the state; and the 3 Governor, who shall be ex officio president of each board. The president of the student government association and the 5 president of the faculty senate shall be ex officio nonvoting 6 members of each board.

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- b. The membership of each board shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- (2) Before October 1, 2014, the initial trustees shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.
- (3) The membership of each board shall be divided into three classes so that at least one third of the members shall be appointed biennially. Of the first members appointed to the board, three shall be designated by the Governor to serve until September 30, 2017; four until September 30, 2019; and four to serve until September 30, 2020.
- (4)a. The successors to the terms of the initial trustees of each board shall hold office for a term of six years and shall not serve more than three consecutive full six-year terms on the board; provided, however, that a trustee shall retire from the board and vacate office at the annual meeting of the board following the seventieth birthday of the trustee. If a trustee appointed from a congressional district ceases to be a bona fide resident and qualified elector of the

district from which appointed, or ceases to have a verifiable physical presence in that district, the trustee shall vacate his or her office. Election of additional and successor trustees or of trustees to fill any vacancy created by the expiration of a term or by the death or resignation of any member or from any other cause shall be by the remaining members of the respective board by secret ballot. Any trustee elected by the board shall hold office from the date of his or her election until confirmation or rejection by the Senate. If the person is elected to serve as a trustee, and, if confirmed, the person shall serve until the expiration of the term for which he or she was elected, and until a successor is elected.

b. At each meeting of the Legislature, the
Superintendent of Education shall certify to the Senate the
names of all those persons who have been elected since the
last session of the Legislature, and the Senate shall confirm
or reject them, as it shall determine is for the best interest
of the respective universities. If it rejects the names of any
members, it shall elect trustees in the stead of those
rejected. No trustee shall receive any pay or emolument other
than his or her actual expenses incurred in the discharge of
his or her duties. Upon the vacation of office by a trustee,
the respective board, if it desires, may bestow upon a trustee
the honorary title of trustee emeritus, but the status shall
confer no responsibilities, duties, rights, or privileges as
trustee emeritus.

1 (b) The Board of Trustees for the University of 2 Alabama shall transfer any assets and liabilities of the University of Alabama at Birmingham and the University of 3 Alabama at Huntsville to the respective board of each university. 5 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 6 7

shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment: "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, to create separate boards of trustees for the University of Alabama at Birmingham and the University of Alabama at Huntsville; to provide for the composition, powers, and duties of each board; and to provide for the transfer of assets and liabilities of both universities to their respective boards.

"Proposed by Act ."

This description shall be followed by the following language:

24 "Yes ( ) No ( )."

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
