(b) The information shall be provided to the patient 8 in writing and in advance of obtaining consent to the surgical 9 10 procedure. (c) The information provided shall include at least 11 12 the following: 13 (1) A description of the various reconstructive 14 options and the advantages and disadvantages of each. 15 (2) A description of the provisions assuring coverage by public and private insurance plans of the costs 16 17 related to reconstructive surgery under federal and state law. (3) A description of how a patient may access 18 reconstructive care, including the potential of transferring 19 care to a facility that provides reconstructive care or
