24	Section 1. (a) This act shall apply to commercial
25	food service establishments that utilize grease traps.
26	(b)(1) Grease traps with manholes shall be of
27	gas-tight construction and shall be designed to withstand

expected loads and prevent access by children. The manhole

cover shall be secured by a bolt or locking mechanism or shall

have sufficient weight to prevent unauthorized access.

- (2) A commercial food service establishment shall insure that a grease trap manhole is secured and locked at all times.
- (c) The Department of Public Health shall adopt rules for the implementation and administration of this act.
- traps must comply with subsection (b) no later than six months after the effective date of this act. Failure to comply with the requirements of subsection (b) shall result in the assessment of a five hundred dollar (\$500) civil penalty to be assessed by the Alabama Department of Public Health. Every day that the violation is not corrected shall result in an additional civil penalty. All moneys received from civil penalties under this act shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the Alabama Department of Public Health to be used for the administration and enforcement of this act.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
