13	Reform was created by the Legislature during the 2016 First
14	Special Session (Act 2016-480) to examine the structure and

17	WHEREAS, the task force, recreated by Act 2017-63,
18	SJR52, 2017 Regular Session, has held numerous meetings to
19	hear testimony and examine potential policy approaches
20	relating to the expenditures of state government within the
21	General Fund and the existing structure of the state budgeting
22	process; and
23	WHEREAS, due to the diligent work of task force
24	members, the task force has made significant progress in
25	formulating suggested policy changes to the budgeting process

3	WHEREAS, task force members are commended for their

14	changes to state budgeting practices including, but not
15	limited to:
16	(1) Adjustments to the budgeting process for the
17	Education Trust Fund and General Fund.
18	(2) Requiring state entities to undergo greater
19	performance and program reviews.
20	(3) Unearmarking funds in order to provide for
21	greater legislative oversight and appropriating flexibility.
22	(4) Reviewing existing state tax credits,
23	deductions, and exemptions that result in the loss of
24	approximately \$4.5 billion in revenue to our state budgets
25	each year, and creating a policy to ensure that future tax

credits effectively provide economic gain to the state.

- (d) The task force shall meet periodically as determined by the co-chairs and shall report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later than the 15th legislative day of the 2019 Regular Session, whereupon the task force shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities.
- (e) Each member of the task force shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the task force in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. These payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the state Comptroller on the State Treasury.
