8	RECOGNIZING THE HARRIS BARRETT SCHOOL ALUMNI IN
9	TUSKEGEE, ALABAMA, FOR OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT.

11	WHEREAS, Harris Barrett School, an original two-room
12	schoolhouse in Tuskegee, Alabama, that is listed on the
13	Alabama Historical Commission, was founded in 1904 as a "call"
14	to local farmers from famous educator and founder of then
15	Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institute, Dr. Booker T.
16	Washington; and
17	WHEREAS, Dr. Washington named the school for a close
18	friend and leader, Harris Barrett, who founded and opened the
19	first black savings and loan association, Peoples Savings and
20	Loan of Hampton, Virginia; and
21	WHEREAS, Harris Barrett School is known as the
22	"Brick School" as students attending Tuskegee Normal and
23	Industrial Institute made the original bricks and built the
24	school under the guidance of Dr. Washington; many of the
25	original bricks showcase fingerprints of the students that
26	bear testament to the enthusiasm and zest of the students to

1 learn as they molded the mud to make the bricks that built the 2 two-room schoolhouse; and WHEREAS, Harris Barrett School, at its height, 3 enrolled 200 students for a three-year term from 1903 until 5 1958; and WHEREAS, Harris Barrett School has several original 7 alumni who continue to support Harris Barrett School including 8 Alphonso Moore, Henry Howard, Juanita Trotter, Rocelius 9 Hudson, Ruth Stanback, Louise Campbell, Bill Baker, and 10 Memphis Boston who attended the two-room schoolhouse; and WHEREAS, the alumni and relatives of Harris Barrett, 11 12 Jan and Grover Fountain, host a fish fry each month at the 13 two-room schoolhouse and greet tourists who come from across 14 the country to hear the many stories of the early years in 15 Tuskegee at Harris Barrett School and to sit in the original wooden desks inside the schoolhouse; and 16 17 WHEREAS, it should be noted that Harris Barrett 18 School laid the educational foundation for the Rosenwald Schools that were built in America with several in Alabama in 19 20 1917; and 21 WHEREAS, historically, Harris Barrett Schoolhouse 22 was used for community and agricultural meetings and 23 demonstrations, one of which was the Jesup Agricultural Wagon, 24 founded by Dr. George Washington Carver; now therefore, 25 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the alumni of Harris Barrett 26

School are hereby honored and commended, and this resolution
