1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
2	Section 1. Section 41-7A-48, Code of Alabama 1975,
3	is amended to read as follows:
4	"\$41-7A-48.
5	"Incentives granted pursuant to this article shall
6	<pre>be limited as follows:</pre>
7	"(1) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009,
8	the aggregate cap of incentives granted under pursuant to this
9	article shall not exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for
10	all qualified production companies.
11	"(2) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010,
12	the aggregate cap of incentives granted under pursuant to this
13	article shall not exceed seven million five hundred thousand
14	dollars (\$7,500,000) for all qualified production companies.
15	"(3) For fiscal years ending September 30, 2011, and
16	September 30, 2012, the aggregate cap of incentives granted
17	under pursuant to this article shall not exceed ten million
18	dollars (\$10,000,000) for all qualified production companies.
19	"(4) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013,
20	the aggregate cap of incentives granted under pursuant to this
21	article shall not exceed fifteen million dollars
22	(\$15,000,000).
23	"(5) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014,
24	the aggregate cap of incentives granted under pursuant to this
25	article shall not exceed fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000)

9	article shall not exceed forty million dollars (\$40,000,000).
10	"(8) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021,
11	the aggregate cap of incentives granted pursuant to this
12	article shall not exceed fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000)."
13	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
