8	Relating to public health; to authorize the
9	Department of Public Health to provide education and services
10	regarding care for individuals with Alzheimer's disease,
11	dementia, or related diseases to those individuals, their

14	1975, in order to remove the responsibility and authority to
15	do so from the Department of Mental Health; and to provide for
16	funding.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited
19	as the Dementia Education and Training Act <u>Alabama Alzheimer's</u>
20	and Dementia Education, Care, and Training Act.
21	Section 2. The purposes of this act are:
22	(1) To enable Alabamians with Alzheimer's disease,
23	dementia, or related diseases to live with dignity in their
24	homes or community for as long as possible.
25	(2) To develop an array of services that follows
26	individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related
27	diseases and maintains their independence in the community.

1 (3) To provide appropriate services for Alabamians
2 with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases
3 residing in both rural and urban settings.

- (4) To emphasize and implement cost-efficient, low-technology, high-yield services that can currently benefit thousands of Alabama citizens.
- (5) To allow Alabamians to pay for services based on their individual resources.

Section 3. (a) Subject to Section 5, the Department of Public Health shall develop educational programs and array of is authorized to develop educational programs and services concerning Alzheimer's disease, dementia, and related diseases. These programs and services shall be offered to individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases, the families of these individuals, and the general public.

- (b) (1) The department $\frac{1}{2}$ may provide instructors to train and provide support to each of the following:
- a. Members of the families of individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar diseases.
- b. Health care providers who provide care for individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar diseases at the home of the individual or a member of the family of the individual, or a similar residential location.
- c. Other caregivers who provide care for individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar diseases at the

home of the affected individual or a member of the family of the individual, or similar residential location.

- (2) These instructors shall may provide technical assistance, training, support, and advice that will accomplish both of the following:
 - a. Encourage the providing of long-term care for such individuals in the home of the individual, or a member of the family of the individual, or a similar residential location.
 - b. Reduce health care costs to the state, the family of the affected individual, and health care facilities.
 - Section 4. The Department of Public Health $\frac{1}{2}$ may adopt rules to implement this act.
 - Section 5. (a) The Legislature shall appropriate sufficient sums from the Education Trust Fund for each of the four fiscal years commencing with the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to establish and implement the requirements of this act. Thereafter, sufficient funding shall be annually appropriated by the Legislature to maintain the programs and services required by this act.
 - The Legislature is authorized to appropriate funding to establish and implement the requirements of this act and to maintain the programs and services required by this act.
 - (b) The Department of Public Health $\frac{1}{1}$ is authorized to implement the requirements of this act to the extent funding is provided.

1 (c) The department may accept gifts, grants, and 2 donations offered in support of the services established by 3 this act.

(d) The department may assess reasonable fees from recipients of the services provided by this act, if the recipient is able to pay for the services. If the recipient is able to pay a portion of a fee, the department shall collect that portion from the recipient. All fees collected shall be used by the department for the purposes of this act.

Section 6. Sections 22-50-70, 22-50-71, 22-50-72, 22-50-73, and 22-50-74, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to domestic dementia education and training, are repealed.

Section 7. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month October 1, 2019, following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
