PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO APPEAR ON THE BALLOT STATEWIDE

STATEWIDE AMENDMENT 1

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to amend Article VIII of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 177 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, to provide that only a citizen of the United States has the right to vote. (Proposed by Act 2019-330)

STATEWIDE AMENDMENT 2

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to increase the membership of the Judicial Inquiry Commission and further provide for the appointment of the additional members; further provide for the membership of the Court of the Judiciary and further provide for the appointment of the additional members; further provide for the process of disqualifying an active judge; repeal provisions providing for the impeachment of Supreme Court Justices and appellate judges and the removal for cause of the judges of the district and circuit courts, judges of the probate courts, and judges of certain other courts by the Supreme Court; delete the authority of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court to appoint an Administrative Director Courts; provide the Supreme Court of Alabama with authority to appoint an Administrative Director of Courts; require the Legislature to establish procedures for the appointment of the Administrative Director of Courts; delete the requirement that a district court hold court in each incorporated municipality with a population of 1,000 or more where there is no municipal court; provide that the procedure for the filling of vacancies in the office of a judge may be changed by local constitutional amendment; delete certain language relating to the position of constable holding more than one state office; delete a provision providing for the temporary maintenance of the prior judicial system; repeal the office of circuit solicitor; and make certain nonsubstantive stylistic changes. Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that a judge, other than a judge of probate, appointed to fill a vacancy would serve an initial term until the first Monday after the second Tuesday in January following the next general election after the judge has completed two years in office. (Proposed by Act 2019-346)

MONTGOMERY SCHOOL TAX DISTRICT MONTGOMERY COUNTY, ALABAMA

SPECIAL ELECTION FOR LEVY OF A DISTRICT TAX (Amendment No. 382, Constitution of Alabama of 1901)

Shall the governing body of Montgomery County, Alabama, be authorized to levy annually, for a period of twenty-seven (27) successive years, commencing with the levy for the tax year that will begin on October 1, 2022 (for which tax year taxes will become due and payable on October 1, 2023), for public school purposes in the Montgomery School Tax District in said county (the area comprising the said district being all the area lying within the boundaries of the said county less and except the area lying within the corporate limits of the City of Pike Road), a special district tax at the adjusted rate of \$1.85 on each one hundred dollars (equal to 18.5 mills on each dollar) of the assessed value of taxable property located within the said district, such that the total number of district mills levied in said district for public school purposes shall be 18.5, said levy at such rate to be in lieu of any district tax now being levied in any part of the said district under the provisions of either Section 2 of Amendment No. 3 or Amendment No. 778 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901?
