10	WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the
11	death of Mr. John L. Granger of Talladega, Alabama, on May 5,
12	2019, at the age of 93 years; his passing leaves a void in the
13	lives of his loving family, many friends, and the entire
14	community, where he was highly regarded; and
15	WHEREAS, he was born in 1925 in Houston County,
16	Alabama, to John and Ruby Granger; he went to Talladega to
17	enter elementary school at the Alabama School for the Blind;
18	at ASB he made lifelong friends, played trumpet in Eugene
19	Landreth's band, and at his death was the longest serving
20	member of the ASB Alumni and Workers Association; and
21	WHEREAS, Mr. Granger's desire in life was to open
22	doors for people who are blind; he began his career at Alabama
23	Industries for the Blind in Talladega; later, he and his
24	family moved to Hazlehurst, Mississippi, where he established
25	Royal Maid Association for the Blind, the national
26	demonstration industry affiliated with National Industries for
27	the Blind; and

WHEREAS, in 1996, Mr. Granger retired from Royal 1 2 Maid and returned to Talladega; he was an active member of the First United Methodist Church, the Alumni and Workers 3 Association of Alabama School for the Blind, and Alabama 5 Council for the Blind; he served on the advisory board for the Regional Library for the Blind, and he was appointed to the 6 7 Board of Trustees for Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind; in 2008, the board added the name John Granger to the McFaden 9 Industries for the Blind Complex in Talladega; and 10 WHEREAS, he was an avid horseman; he enjoyed woodworking, including restoring old chairs, refinishing 11 12 furniture, making stools and birdhouses; at the age of 93, 13 with help from his daughter and son-in-law, he was able to build and distribute his famous log cabin birdhouses; and 14 15 WHEREAS, he was predeceased by his parents; his beloved wife of 65 years, Mary Davis Granger; and son, John 16 17 Charles Granger; his survivors include his children, Roy 18 Granger (Joyce), Jeanne Perkins (Bill), Cathy Sparkman (Billy), and Martha Olvera (Russell); grandchildren, Scott 19 20 Sparkman (Stacy), Leslie Johnson (Rob), Matt Perkins (Rebecca 21 Keaton), Lauren McCook (Matt), Christie Smith (Jimmie), 22 Jennifer Widger (Steve), John Granger (Mindy), Chuck Granger, and Jake Granger (Molly); 18 great-grandchildren; and a host 23 24 of other relatives and many friends; and 25 WHEREAS, he greeted each day with humor, enthusiasm, respect, love, and a plan; although his presence will be 26
