25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. The following amendment to the
27	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become

valid as a part of the constitution when all requirements of this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Beginning with the 2024 cycle, the Cullman County Superintendent of Education shall be elected for a four-year term by the qualified electors of the county zoned for the county school system, and the Legislature, by local law, may provide further for the election, qualifications, and powers of the county superintendent of education.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held at the General Election in 2022, in accordance with Sections 284 and 284.01 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Relating to Cullman County, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that the county superintendent of education shall be elected by the qualified electors of the county in 2024 for a four-year term.

This description shall be followed by the following language:
