13		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
14		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
15		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
16		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
17		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
18		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
19		becoming effective with regard to a local
20		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
21		unless: it comes within one of a number of
22		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
23		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates
24		funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
25		the entity for the purpose.
26		The purpose or effect of this bill would be
27		to require a new or increased expenditure of local

1 funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, 2 the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to 3 become effective because it comes within one of the 5 specified exceptions contained in the amendment. 6 7 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 8 AN ACT 9 10 To amend Section 9-13-60, Code of Alabama 1975, as 11 12 amended by Act 2010-704, 2010 Regular Session (Acts 2010, p. 13 1706), to further provide the current criminal violations for unauthorized actions related to the removal of timber or other 14 forest products to include deceptive practices; and in 15 connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the 16 17 requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of 18 Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the 19 20 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, 21 as amended. 22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. Section 9-13-60, Code of Alabama 1975, as 23 24 amended by Act 2010-704, 2010 Regular Session (Acts 2010, p. 25 1706), is amended to read as follows:

"\$9-13-60.

- "(a) It is unlawful for any person or persons to do
 any of the following:
- "(1) Willfully and knowingly cut, kill, destroy,

 girdle, chop, chip, saw or otherwise damage timber or forest

 products not his own or without authority of the legal owner.

- "(2) Willfully and knowingly remove timber or other forest products other than his own or without authority of the legal owner.
- "(3) Willfully and knowingly transport timber or other forest products which have been severed or removed in violation of subdivisions (1) or (2) of this section.
- "(4) Willfully and knowingly purchase or contract to purchase or otherwise obtain timber or forest products severed, removed or transported in violation of subdivisions (1), (2) or (3) of this section.
- "(5) Willfully and knowingly sell, contract to sell or otherwise dispose of logs, poles, piling, crossties, pulpwood, veneer bolts, staves or other unmanufactured or semimanufactured forest products not his or her own or without authority of the legal owner.
- "(6) Alter or by any means cause a weight measuring device to give a false reading as to the actual or true weight of any forest products for the purpose of deceiving or defrauding any person, firm, or corporation.
- "(7) a. Willfully and knowingly remove timber or other forest products of another by means of deception, as defined in Section 13A-8-1.

"b. During a pay-per-unit-type purchase, a purchaser willfully and knowingly fails to disclose to the owner the actual quantity or type of timber or other forest products harvested for the purpose of defrauding the owner and the owner is not paid or otherwise compensated for all the timber or other forest products harvested from the property.

- "(b) A violation of subsection (a) is a Class A misdemeanor and shall be punished as provided by law.
- "(c) This section shall not apply to any utility or corporation engaged in providing electric service. Nor shall it apply to the employees, contractors, agents, or representatives of a utility or corporation engaged in providing electric service where such employees, contractors, agents, or representatives are acting within the course and scope of their employment, contract, or agency."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
