22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. (a) Any person who seeks election and/or
24	seeks ballot access for any election to any public office that
25	has an age requirement for election to that office shall
26	provide a certified copy of his or her birth certificate that

- includes the date and place of birth when the person qualifies for election to that office.
- 3 (b) A person subject to the requirement of
 4 subsection (a) who fails to provide a copy of his or her birth
 5 certificate shall not have his or her name appear on an
 6 election ballot.

Section 2. The political party or other official receiving the qualifying papers shall forward copies of the certified birth certificates to the Secretary of State for proof of legal ballot access. The Secretary of State shall hold the copies of the birth certificates until the official results are certified, or until any legal challenge to a certification is disposed of, following which time they shall be destroyed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
