- (b) Any person who violates any ordinances or resolutions by violating any rule or regulation adopted by the Shelby County Commission pursuant to subsection (a) shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor punishable as provided by law.
- (c) No ordinance or resolution adopted pursuant to this act may conflict with state law.
- (d) An ordinance or resolution may provide that a person charged with a violation may be issued a non-traffic citation and complaint to appear in the district court of the county.
- (e) The county commission shall keep a copy of all ordinances or resolutions adopted pursuant to this act available for public inspection at the offices of the county manager.
- (f) This act is adopted pursuant to Section 6 of Amendment No. 707 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 3 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
