A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

Relating to Macon County; to amend Section 16 of Act 97-663, 1997 Regular Session (Acts 1997, p. 1272), as amended by Act 2010-525; to further provide for the duties of the members of the county commission related to roads and bridges in the county.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 16 of Act 97-663, 1997 Regular Session (Acts 1997, p. 1272), as amended by Act 2010-525, is further amended to read as follows:

"Section 16. Each member of the county commission may inspect the roads and bridges of his or her district from time to time. The members of the county commission may also assist in securing right-of-way and assist in public relations generally. Each member of the county commission may elect to direct a crew to maintain the unpaved roads in his or her

1 district and to address the complaints and concerns of the  
2 citizens of his or her district. The personnel and equipment  
3 for any such crew shall be determined by the county commission  
4 in session, and the expenses for any crew shall come out of  
5 the overall budget for the construction, maintenance, and  
6 repairs of the county roads, bridges, and ferries of Macon  
7 County. Any commissioner electing to direct a crew will be the  
8 custodian and accountable to the county commission for all  
9 road machinery, equipment, tools, supplies, and repair parts  
10 owned by Macon County and used by his or her crew. The county  
11 commission shall establish necessary policies and regulations  
12 governing accountability for the county owned equipment.  
13 Request for requisitions for all materials, machinery,  
14 equipment, and supplies necessary for the operation of any  
15 crew shall be routed through the county engineer, or presented  
16 to the commission in session."

17 Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict  
18 with this act are repealed.

19 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the  
20 first day of the third month following its passage and  
21 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
