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To amend Section 22-50-2.1, of the Code of Alabama

1975, relating to the Department of Mental Health; to change

the terminology from "intellectual disability" to

"developmental disability" and to change the terminology from

"people with intellectual disabilities" to "people with

developmental disabilities"; and to add Section 2 of this act

to the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for Medicaid waivers.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 22-50-2.1, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"22-50-2.1.

- "(a) All rights, duties, property, real or personal, and all other effects existing in names of the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, or in any other name by which the department has been known, shall continue in the name of the Department of Mental Health. Any existing or future reference to the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, or any other name by which the department has been known, in any existing law, contract, or other instrument shall constitute a reference to the Department of Mental Health.
- "(b) The Advisory Board of Trustees for the

 Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation shall

 continue in existence as the Advisory Board of Trustees of the

 Department of Mental Health.
- "(c) A reasonable transition period for the name change shall be allowed to permit an orderly and

cost-effective transition relating particularly to the use of equipment and supplies. All letterhead, business cards, forms, and any other materials in use by the commission containing the name Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation shall continue to be used by the Department of Mental Health until the supplies are exhausted. Replacement supplies shall contain the name of the Department of Mental Health.

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"(d) In addition to changes in Section 29-7-13, the Code Commissioner, at times determined appropriate, shall change all references to mental retardation in this code as follows: All references to "mentally retarded" or "people with an intellectual disability" shall be changed to "people with an intellectual a developmental disability" and all references to "mental retardation" shall be changed to or "intellectual disability" shall be changed to "developmental disability." This change in terminology is intended to be a name change only and it shall not limit or expand the eligibility for any programs or services provided by any state or local agency. This change in terminology is intended to reflect the understanding that intellectual disabilities are but a subset of a wider range of developmental disabilities. For purposes of this subsection, the terms "intellectual disability" and "developmental disabi<u>lity" have the meanings provided in</u> Section 2 of the act adding this sentence."

Section 2. For purposes of this act and Title 22, the following words shall have the following meanings:

(1) AGENCY. The Alabama Medicaid Agency.

1 (2) DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY. A severe, chronic 2 disability of an individual that: a. Is attributable to a mental or physical 3 impairment or combination of mental and physical impairments. b. Is manifested before the individual attains age 5 22. 6 7 c. Is likely to continue indefinitely. d. Results in substantial functional limitations in 8 three or more of the following areas of major life activity: 9 10 1. Self-care. 2. Receptive and expressive language. 11 12 3. Learning. 13 4. Mobility. 5. Self-direction. 14 15 6. Capacity for independent living. 7. Economic self-sufficiency. 16 17 e. Reflects the individual's need for a combination and sequence of special, interdisciplinary, or generic 18 services, individualized supports, or other forms of 19 assistance that are of lifelong or extended duration and are 20 21 individually planned and coordinated. 2.2 (3) INTELLECTUAL DISABILITY. A developmental 23 disability attributable to a mental impairment. 24 (4) WAIVER. The home and community based waiver 25 program operated within the State of Alabama by the Alabama

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Medicaid Agency, including, but not limited to, the following:

a. Elderly and Disabled Waiver.

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b. HIV/AIDS Waiver. 1 2 c. Living at Home Waiver. d. Intellectual Disabilities Waiver. 3 e. State of Alabama Independent Living Waiver. f. Technology Assisted Waiver for Adults. 5 Section 3. The agency shall not deny eligibility for 6 7 a waiver to applicants with developmental disabilities solely for the lack of an intellectual disability finding if such 8 applicants would otherwise be eligible under the federal 9 10 regulations. Section 4. This act shall become effective on the 11 12 first day of the third month following its passage and 13 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
