20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. Section 4 of Act 524 of the 1965 Regular
22	Session (Acts 1965, p. 766), is amended to read as follows:
23	"Section 4. The taxes levied by this act shall
24	become effective, or go into effect, on the first day of the
25	calendar month next following that calendar month in which
26	there is adopted an act creating in every county of the State
27	having a population of 500,000 or more, according to the last

or any subsequent Federal census, a public corporation for the purpose of establishing, maintaining and operating a civic center in the county seat of said county provided, however, that if the last mentioned act has been enacted prior to this act becoming law, then the taxes levied by this act shall become effective, and go into effect, on the first day of that calendar month next following the calendar month in which this act becomes a law.

"(a) Subject to subsection (b), the proceeds from
the taxes levied by this act shall be paid into the general
treasury of the county as received and collected may be
expended for county public purposes and in the manner as the
governing body of the county shall determine.

(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, that portion of the proceeds of this tax that on the effective date of the act adding this subsection are pledged to or used for the payment of bonds issued for the financing of the Birmingham Jefferson Civic Center may not be used for any other purpose.

"(c) The county may increase the tax provided for by subsection (a) of this section by resolution which shall be subject to the provisions of subsection (d) of this section.

"(d) (1) A resolution enacted by the Jefferson County

Commission increasing the tax on tobacco products may not be

effective unless it is approved by an affirmative vote of a

majority of the voters of Jefferson County.

1	"(2) The Jefferson County Commission shall advertise
2	the resolution to increase the tax on tobacco products in a
3	newspaper published in Jefferson County and posted on its
4	website for three consecutive weeks prior to an election
5	concerning the resolution.
6	"(3) The notice of the election shall be given by
7	the judge of probate, and the election shall be held,
8	conducted, and the results canvassed in the manner as other
9	county elections. The question shall be, "Do you approve the
10	resolution increasing the tax on tobacco products proposed by
11	the Jefferson County Commission? Yes () No ()" The county
12	shall pay any costs and expenses not otherwise reimbursed by a
13	governmental agency which are incidental to the election. If a
14	majority of the votes cast in the election are "Yes," the
15	resolution shall become operative immediately. If the majority
16	of the votes are "No," the resolution shall be repealed and
17	shall have no further effect. The Judge of Probate of
18	Jefferson County shall certify the results of the election to
19	the Secretary of State."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
