8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, an admission ticket that
9 was originally issued, sold, or authorized by an
10 organizer or venue to any athletic contest, dance,
11 theater, concert, circus, or other amusement event
12 is required to have the purchase price printed on
13 the face of the ticket and may be resold for an
14 amount in excess of the price printed on the face

of the ticket.

This bill would provide that an admission ticket for any event designed as a benefit or any event for charitable purposes may not be resold for an amount in excess of the price printed on the face of the ticket and would provide penalties.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local

governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

To amend Section 8-19E-2 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the resale of an admission ticket; to provide that an admission ticket for any event designed as a benefit or any event for charitable purposes may not be resold for an amount in excess of the price printed on the face of the ticket; to provide penalties; and in connection therewith to have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now

1	appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of
2	the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
4	Section 1. Section 8-19E-2 of the Code of Alabama
5	1975, is amended to read as follows:

7	"(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), an An
8	admission ticket that was originally issued, sold, or
9	authorized by the organizer or venue to any athletic contest,

13	"(b)(1) An admission ticket for an event as

19	Section 2. Although this bill would have as its

23	appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of

the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the

bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
