Section 1. (a) In addition to any other fees

provided for by law, a fee of ten dollars (\$10) shall be

collected on all certificates of registration for vessels

registered in this state under Chapter 5 of Title 33 of the

Code of Alabama 1975.

- (b) The funds collected pursuant to this section shall be distributed to Victims of Crime and Leniency (VOCAL) for the purposes of this act.
- Section 2. (a) The funds collected under Section 1 shall be remitted to VOCAL to be used to establish the Quenette Shehane Crime Victims Program.
- (b) The Quenette Shehane Crime Victims Program shall assist victims of violent crimes and the families of victims of violent crimes by providing first responders for immediate crisis intervention, counseling, crime scene cleanup, criminal justice support, assistance with funeral arrangements, and assistance with compensation filing.
- (c) The Quenette Shehane Crime Victims Program shall be operated by the VOCAL Board of Directors, which may do all of the following:
- (1) Employ a project director who shall be in control of the daily operations of the Quenette Shehane Crime Victims Program.
- (2) Employ a licensed professional counselor to facilitate and supervise first responders.
- (3) Conduct an annual evaluation to provide information on efficiency and adequacy of services provided.

(4) Provide a report of the financial condition of the Quenette Shehane Crime Victims Program to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives at least 30 days prior to the end of each fiscal year.

- (5) Conduct an annual financial audit by a private firm and provide an accounting for all incomes and expenditures.
- (6) Provide an annual accounting of services delivered to victims or the families of victims.
- (7) Utilize funds to provide first responders for judicial circuits to work with the county coroner and law enforcement to assist and provide crisis intervention to the victims of violent crimes or the families of victims of violent crimes and provide annual continuing education seminars to the participating coroners and law enforcement.
- (8) Draft a Memorandum of Governing Principles outlining the general guidelines and regulations of the Quenette Shehane Crime Victims Program and keep the memorandum as a public record.
- (d)(1) The funds collected pursuant to this act shall be sent to the VOCAL Board on the tenth day of each month by the collecting authority in each county and the VOCAL Board shall have the authority to expend the funds collected in accordance with this act.
- (2) The VOCAL Board shall keep detailed records of all expenditures and disbursements of funds collected pursuant to this act for at least five years.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
